Emergency managers throughout the state of Florida participated in a statewide training exercise on May 19th as part of Hurricane Preparedness Week. The scenario helped to prepare government agencies and community response partners for the hurricane season which begins on June 1st. The City of Weston utilized its Emergency Operations Center (EOC)

for the training, which gathered essential personnel together to work through the various scenarios designed to give staff hands-on experience with the response and recovery process should a storm impact our area.

The City interacted with Broward County and other municipalities during the exercise.

WESTON CERT HOSTS REGIONAL DISASTER DRILL

WESTON REGIONAL PARK TRANSFORMED SITE OF "MASS CASUALTIES"

SMALL PLANE CRASH WITH MULTIPLE VICTIMS

BSO Fire Rescue & Emergency Services and the Weston Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) hosted a CERT Regional Training Drill at the Weston Regional Park on Sunday, May 21, 2016.

Members of CERT are your neighbors – ordinary men and women who have completed training, provided free of charge by BSO Fire Rescue, on disaster response skills such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization and disaster medical operations.



After some classroom review enhanced and training, **CFRT** members received their activation notification and deployed to the site strewn with victims from a fictitious small plane crash. CERT members implement Incident Command the System, conducted a scene size-up, performed mass casualty triage, fire suppression and search and rescue.

Following a large scale incident hurricane, such as a local responders emergency initially become overwhelmed. CERT members apply their training to give critical support in the immediate area until help arrives. Members also assist with non-emergency projects that improve the safety of the community.

The half-staff position remembers the more than one million men and women who gave their lives in service of their country. The official totals are not in yet, but an estimated 450 vehicles drove through the Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) and Electronics Recycling collection event last Sunday at the City of Weston's Public Works Services Center. The event is hosted regularly by Broward County in various municipalities. The turnout in Weston was much greater than anticipated, since an event was also held in our City this January that attracted over 900 participants.

WATER SMART SAFE AQUATIC OUTINGS

Summer vacation means warm temperatures, long daylight hours, no school and a challenge to keep children occupied and safe. Many children attend summer camps offered by various organizations, which often include aquatic activities. Whether it is swimming at a community pool or field trips to the beach or water parks, it is important to note that the primary risk factor for drowning is the lack of capable, close and constant adult supervision. Therefore, parents are encouraged to discuss the organization's safety measures when it comes to aquatic outings with camp directors.

The American Red Cross recommends the following to organizations that host group aquatic outings:



Provide constant, close and competent adult supervision of children at all times. Identify at-risk swimmers.



Staff should know how to perform rescue breathing and CPR.



A Safe Swim Day checklist that requires: rules and responsibilities of staff and volunteers.



An Emergency Action Plan and documented practices.

Tragic water accidents happen quickly. Anyone that takes children on outings involving water must be vigilant. Being prepared is the key to safety.






SAFE SELLING TRANSACTION ZONE A LOCATION FOR ONLINE BUYERS/SELLERS
