Young at Art Museum was instrumental in providing professionals to assist in the judging of the student's work and providing museum passes as a thank you for their participation.





FICUS HEDGE PRUNING ALONG CITY RIGHT OF WAYS

Seasonal Maintenance Keeps Ficus Hedges Healthy



Last week landscape crews began performing regular maintenance on Ficus hedges in certain areas of the City. Only sections of hedges that have encroached on to the sidewalks (as shown in the photo to the left) will be addressed. The maintenance will include pruning and fertilization. Work will begin along Saddle Club Road and the process will take about three weeks.

The hedges normally fill back in within one month of pruning. Crews also continue to monitor the hedges to control possible white fly infestation.

Spring and summer is the best time to prune these hedges. You may notice some areas that are heavily pruned, which is just part of the maintenance regimen to maintain the overall health of the tree. The hedges fill in and grow back quickly.

Bring your items to the Weston Public Works Services Center, located on South Post Road between Manatee Isles Drive and Saddle Club Road, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.



Just drive up - crews will remove items for you.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) refers to used or leftover contents of consumer products that contain chemicals with one of the four characteristics: *Toxic, Ignitable, Corrosive, or Reactive* as defined by the Environmental Protection Agency. The Household Hazardous Waste and Electronics Recycling event is held in Weston twice annually. Events will be posted on Westonfl.org/Events as they are scheduled for 2017.


WESTON EXPLORERS ATTEND STATE TRAINING



A group from the BSO Weston Police Explorers Post 44 participated in the Florida Association of Police Explorers Delegate Training from April $22^{nd} - 24^{th}$. The Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office hosted the explorers at their 2500 acre training facility, which has a simulated town complete with a bank, convenience store/gas station, as well as houses for searching, an airplane fuselage and other building gear to accommodate multiple Law Enforcement instruction scenarios. Weston's Explorers participated in over 20 different exercises from low and high risk traffic stops, building searches, crime scene processing, active shooter training, and team building activities.

Explorer posts from law enforcement agencies from Tallahassee to Miami were in attendance, representing over 20 different agencies at the Federal, County and the Local level. The training helped to prepare the Explorers for future State and National Competitions.

The BSO Law Enforcement Explorer Program is for young men & women ages 14-21. The program allows participants to interact with law enforcement and other community advisors in a serious, regimented atmosphere where the students can demonstrate their personal initiative. HEALTHY LIVING TIP FOR HEALTHY VISION MONTH

Keep Your Eyes Healthy: Wear Sunglasses

Sunglasses have practical uses other than just as a fashion accessory to a particular outfit. Throughout this summer it is important to remember that in order to have the most fun, you need to protect yourself! Here are three reasons why wearing sunglasses can improve life in the summer sun:

Sunglasses will help to protect your eyes from harmful UV Rays.

Ultraviolet (UV) radiation has been linked to the development of many eye problems including cataracts, a serious condition that can lead to impaired vision.

They will also help to prevent wrinkles by protecting the delicate skin around the eyes from premature aging. Good quality sunglasses protect your eyes from 100% of the sun's harmful UV rays.

Sunglasses reduce glare

Most surfaces will reflect light. Water, car windshields, and the road surface can have extremely bright reflections that distract and interfere with vision which can be very dangerous.

Consider sunglasses such as those that include polarized filters or mirror coatings, which will reduce glare for safer and more comfortable vision.



Sunglasses reduce headaches and eyestrain

In very bright conditions, the pupil which controls the amount of light reaching the light sensitive retina, cannot constrict small enough to reduce light to a comfortable level. This causes a person to squint, using the eyelids to further reduce light entering the eye. Muscle fatigue associated with squinting and constant constriction of the pupil can lead to headache and eyestrain.

Sunglasses reduce the amount of light reaching the eyes to a more comfortable level, eliminating the need for squinting and severe pupil constriction.

A model program, COP's are the additional eyes and ears of the community, assisting and enhancing our own BSO policing efforts. Members of the Broward Sheriff's Office Countywide Operations professionally train all volunteers. Typical assignments in addition to patrol, include performing checks on unoccupied residences at owner's

request, checking on elderly or homebound and reporting potential problems and neighborhood hazards and assist at Weston community events.
