WESTON C.E.R.T. VOLUNTEERS OPEN AREA SEARCH, RADIO USAGE & TRIAGE TRAINING

On Wednesday evening, October 26th dedicated members of the Weston Community Emergency Response Team (C.E.R.T.) conducted an Open Search Area training exercise within Emerald Estates Park, practicing several key CERT skills including radio communication, search patterns and triage.

As CERT members arrived, they were briefed and given instructions by Weston District Fire Chief Bruce Angier. **The scenario:** The aftermath of a tornado.

Throughout the exercise, teams recovered 'victims', which in this exercise were represented by wooden rakes. Each 'victim' had a tag attached to it with patient injury information. CERT members reported via radio the victim's discovery, medical status, what measures were taken to stabilize and to which Rapid Triage Color Coding System they would be classified and transported to at the front of the park.



ONE WEEK FROM TODAY ELECTION DAY IS TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 8TH



Election Day is Tuesday, November 8th. **Polls will be open from 7 AM – 7 PM** on this day. Aside from electing our nation's next president, voters will vote on representatives at the state and local level, as well as local referendum questions. **City of Weston voters** will select a new Commissioner for Seat 1, and will also have an amendment to the City's charter for consideration.

Early Voting is Open Daily through November 6th

Vote-By-Mail

In order to vote-by-mail (formerly known as *absentee ballot*) voters must submit a request in writing. The request can be made in person, by mail, by telephone, or you can <u>fill out a request form now</u>. Only the voter or a designated member of his or her immediate family or legal guardian can request an Vote By Mail ballot for the voter. Immediate family means the voter's spouse, parent, child, grandparent, or sibling of the voter or of the voter's spouse. Requests must be received by the Broward Supervisor of Elections Office no later than November 2, 2016.

BUILDING PERMITS

WHY REQUIRED, FOR WHAT & REPERCUSSIONS

There are many important reasons to obtain the required building permit(s) and to obtain the required inspections for your construction project.



Helps Protect Property Value

Your home or business is an investment. If your construction project does not comply with city codes, the value of your investment could be reduced.

Saves Money

Property insurers may not cover work or damages caused by work done without permits and inspections.

Makes Selling Property Easier

When property is sold through a multiple listing association, the owner is required to disclose any improvements or repairs made and if permits and inspections were obtained. Many financial institutions will not finance a purchase without proof of a final inspection. The real estate value will not consider the work that was completed without a permit. If you decide to sell a home or building that has had modifications without a permit, you may be required to tear down the addition, or do costly repairs.

Improves Safety

Your permit allows the code official to reduce potential hazards of unsafe construction to provide for public health, safety and welfare. By following code guidelines, your completed project will meet minimum standards of safety, ensuring that your home will be safe for your family and any future family that lives there. Mandatory inspections complement the contractor's experience and act as a system of checks and balances resulting in a safer project.

BUILDING PERMITS

WHY REQUIRED, FOR WHAT & REPERCUSSIONS - Continued

It's the Law

Building permits are required by the Florida Building Code. Work without a permit on a building, structure, electrical, gas, mechanical or plumbing system before or without obtaining the building official's approval or the necessary permit(s) is subject to a penalty of 100 percent of the required permit fees in addition to the required permit fees. Non-payment of the fees can result in a requirement that the improvements be removed. Satisfying outstanding City Code violations after construction, combined with Florida Building Code fines, can be very expensive.



Be wary and check with the building department yourself. It is ultimately your responsibility to ensure work requiring a permit receives one.

If your project involves minor cosmetic changes, you probably will not have to worry about getting a building permit. If you are making changes to your house's structure, plumbing, or electrical wiring, you will need to obtain permits. The best way to find out whether a permit is required is to call the Weston Building Department.
