DEADLY DRUG AVAILABLE IN BROWARD

Carfentanil – Synthetic Opioid

Powerful Drug Suspected in 53 Recent Deaths in Broward County



The Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) has issued a <u>Carfentanil Warning</u> to the public and law enforcement.

Any drug bought illegally can be laced with Carfentanil and there is a high chance of death.

The Broward Addiction Recovery Center is available to assist individuals with a drug problem



Carfentanil Kills

A drug so powerful it's used to sedate elephants has made it to the streets of Broward and South Florida, and people are dying.

New laboratory testing by the Broward County Office of Medical Examiner and Trauma Services strongly suggests that a suspected **53 recent deaths** in the past 6 months are due to Carfentanil, a synthetic opioid that's 100 times deadlier than fentanyl, which itself is nearly 50 times more lethal than heroin.

Ingesting just a few granules of Carfentanil, the size of table salt can kill you. It is by far the most deadly of the opiates readily available as a street drug.



Carfentanil is so dangerous that First Responders, Medical Examiner and Medical personnel, and even drug-sniffing dogs who breathe its fumes are at risk and must be immediately treated with Narcan (Nalaxone) - a medication used to block the effects of opioids - or face death. In most circumstances, those buying and using drugs off the street don't even know they're ingesting it until it's too late. Even if they have a dose of Narcan available, Carfentanil can kill them before they can use it, according to Dr. Craig Mallak, Broward's Chief Medical Examiner.

BEWARE OF FAKE IRS TAX BILL NOTICES

Warning of Tax Bills related to Affordable Care Act

The Internal Revenue Service and its Security Summit partners are warning taxpayers and tax professionals of fake IRS tax bills related to the Affordable Care Act.

The IRS has received numerous reports of scammers sending a fraudulent version of a notice- labeled CP2000 - for tax year 2015. The issue has been reported to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration for investigation.

This scam may arrive by email, as an attachment, or by mail. It has many signs of being a fake:

- The CP2000 notices appear to be issued from an Austin, Texas, address;
- The letter says the issue is related to the Affordable Care Act and requests information regarding 2014 coverage;
- The payment voucher lists the letter number as 105C;
- Requests checks made out to I.R.S. and sent to the "Austin Processing Center" at a post office box.



IRS impersonation scams take many forms: threatening phone calls, phishing emails and demanding letters. Learn more at <u>Reporting Phishing and Online Scams</u>. The IRS does not initiate unsolicited email contact or contact by social media.

An authentic CP2000 notice is used when income reported from third-party sources such as an employer does not match the income reported on the tax return. Unlike the fake, it provides extensive instructions to taxpayers about what to do if they agree or disagree that additional tax is owed. A real notice requests that checks be made out to "United States Treasury."

The IRS and its Security Summit partners – the state tax agencies and the private-sector tax industry – are conducting a campaign to raise awareness among taxpayer and tax professionals about increasing their security and becoming familiar with various tax-related scams. CALLING 9-1-1

Everyone Should Know How and When to Call for Help Effectively

Help the 911 emergency system help you by remembering these tips when you call for help:

Answer the dispatcher's questions – Know your location

In an emergency, it is important to stay calm. If you do not know the exact address, provide the 911 dispatcher with landmarks or cross streets. If you are in a building, be sure to give the floor and/or office number. Tell the 911 dispatcher what the emergency is: someone is hurt or sick and needs help, there's a fire or someone is trying to break into my house.

Be sure to stay on the line - You will delay response if you hang up

If you accidentally called 911 stay on the line and let the dispatcher know. If you hang up, the 911 dispatcher will call your number back to make sure everything is alright. A law enforcement officer will be dispatched if they get no answer or a busy signal. This will needlessly take resources away from genuine emergencies.

Carefully follow instructions - You can give aide until help arrives

Listen carefully to the 911 dispatcher's questions and answer them to the best of your ability. Until first responders arrive, the dispatcher may provide you with instructions for keeping the patient safe and comfortable. Listen carefully to the instructions.



Teach Your Children How to Call 911

Teach children what 911 is, how to dial from home and cell phones, and to trust the 911 call dispatcher. Children should be physically able to reach at least one phone at home. When calling

911, children need to know their name, parents' name, telephone number and most importantly their address. They should know to answer all the dispatcher's questions and to stay on the phone until instructed to hang up.

Never practice calling 911 on a real phone.




