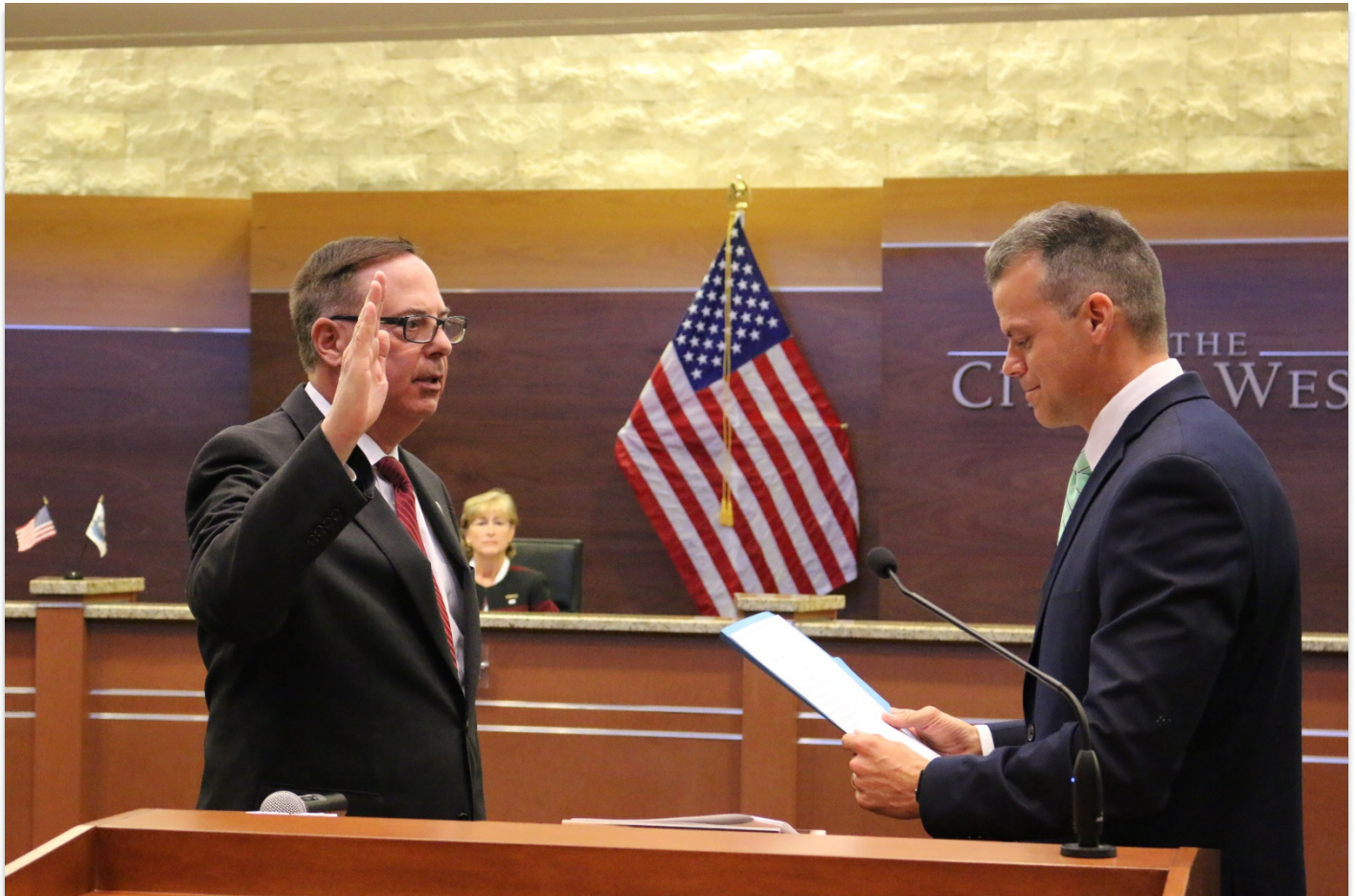


Newly elected City Commissioner Margaret Brown was administered the Oath of Office by husband Eric Brown.

WESTON REGIONAL PARK *Parking Lot Resurfacing Project Underway*



All parking area surfaces and the asphalt walking/jogging paths within the Weston Regional Park are being milled and paved in a resurfacing project underway within the park.

Residents and visitors will see heavy equipment and trucks staged within areas of the park as work is being done progressively through mid-December.

The contractor, Weekley Asphalt Paving, Inc., is phasing the project and working closely with Weston Public Works, Parks & Recreation and the Weston YMCA to minimize or prevent interruption of park or YMCA services.

Included within the project is the installation of tree root barriers, the replacement of damaged curbs and reinstallation of parking and traffic pavement markings. This will be the first time since its opening in 2000, that the entire Regional Park parking lot has been resurfaced.

The Weston Regional Park, is located at 20200 Saddle Club Road, Weston.





MATH MADNESS COMPETITION

Falcon Cove Ranked 9 in Top 100 Highest Scoring Teams

Math Madness is a team-based event that takes place during the Fall in which hundreds of middle schools and high schools from across the country compete to be national champions. The idea behind Math Madness is to create a structure that motivates students throughout the entirety of a school semester. The program encourages active participation weekly so that students can observe actual progress, and in turn, amplify their efforts to continue their success.

AreteLabs, which developed and hosts Math Madness explains the competition as having been modeled “in part after the popular NCAA March Madness Basketball Tournament, the hope is that it will be more easily understood and embraced by the public, and thus, that students will eventually receive the same recognition and support that athletes do to fuel their efforts.” This year, our very own Falcon Cove Middle School placed 9th in the Top 100 Highest Scoring Teams.

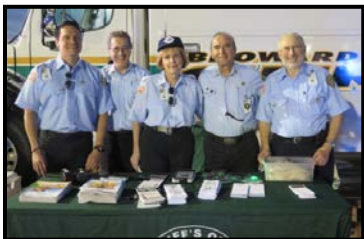

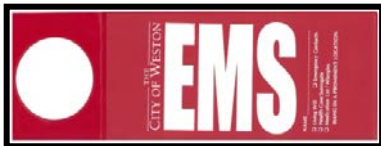
CITIZEN OBSERVER PATROL (C.O.P.) PROGRAM
