

This November, Broward County residents have the opportunity to vote on two ballot questions. *A Penny At Work* represents a proposal for two, half-penny surtaxes that will appear on the November 8th ballot: A half penny is to fund countywide transportation projects and a half penny is to fund local city improvement projects.

The Transportation Half Penny for Broward County

The half penny (.5%) transportation sales surtax would fund countywide improvements, including traffic signal synchronization, expanded senior mobility, and enhanced transit options such as expanded bus system and rail. Projects will be implemented by Broward County. Today's mass transit system will not improve without this.

The Infrastructure Half Penny for the Cities

The half penny for infrastructure would fund individual city projects; including capital improvements to public facilities, water and sewer utility upgrades, the purchase of public safety vehicles and equipment, local transportation and pedestrian safety enhancements (to be coordinated with County transportation projects), and recreation/conservation land acquisition. Funds would be distributed by population. The projects and infrastructure expenditures are determined by the needs of each community.

Weston has always held its appearance and quality of life in high regard. The City has identified nearly 300 projects over the next 30 years to maintain the appearance and value of our community, including water and sewer upgrades, roadway improvements, a new fire station and park in the Bonaventure community, and expansion of the Weston Community Center and improvements to City Parks.



It has been ten years since a Hurricane impacted South Florida, when Hurricane Wilma swept through in 2006, causing much wind damage from downed power lines, uprooted trees, traffic signal outages, and more throughout the County. Although we know it is always a possibility that a storm may impact South Florida anytime during Hurricane season, we tend to procrastinate on storm preparations.

The City of Weston provides a resources on storm preparation gathered together on one webpage. Visit **Westonfl.org/Hurricane** to get started on your plan if you don't already have one for your family or business. The page also contains preparedness tips, contact information for a variety of programs and services, links to county resources and much more.

Remember, when it comes to hurricanes and tropical storms, preparation is key. Storm watches allow residents the time to activate their plans and to gather supplies necessary to ride out the storm and to sustain families for at least 72 hours following the storm.

PREPARE NOW: SURVIAL KIT FOR PETS

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS – A Continuing Series



As you make your hurricane plans for your family, remember to plan for your pet, too. Preparing a *Pet Survival Kit* is key to ensuring that you have enough food and important pet information on hand in case you lose power or must evacuate. Details are available from Ready.gov and from the Humane Society of Broward County.

The kit or container should be waterproof with a secure plastic lid and include the following:

- A crate or carrier large enough for your pet to stand and turn
- Leashes and collars
- Two-week supply of moist or dry food, with manual can opener
- Two-week supply of bottled water (or more if using dry food)
- Water and food dishes
- Extra cat litter, litter pan and puppy training pads (consider the fact that your dog may not be able to "potty" outside during or after a storm)
- Emergency phone numbers for veterinarian, animal shelters, friends or relatives
- Veterinary clinic address and phone number
- Veterinary records with rabies certificate and current Broward County Pet Registration Tag number
- Medications with instructions (ensure you have enough medication on hand before the storm hits)
- Cleaning supplies (newspaper, plastic bags with ties, paper towels, disinfectant)
- A photo of you and your pet together (to help prove the pet is yours), and a photo of the pet by itself, showing any distinguishing marks that will help with identification.

Pet Friendly Shelter: If you plan to evacuate to a shelter with your pet, register in advance with the Humane Society of Broward County at 954-989-3977. Broward County operates one pet-friendly shelter.



Healthy Living Tip FOOD FACTS FOR THE FALL



When talking about food, you'll often hear people refer to the word nutrients. Is the food full of nutrients? Is it a nutrient-rich food? Are you getting your recommended daily serving of nutrients?

What are nutrients and why are they good for you?

Nutrients are the substances in food that our bodies process to enable it to function. Your nutrient requirements are influenced by factors including your age, growth stage and activity. Nutrients are so small that they can't be seen by the naked eye.

Nutrients can generally be broken onto two categories:

Macronutrients – carbohydrates, protein, fats; and

Micronutrients – vitamins and minerals such as calcium, iron, vitamin C.

With the prevalence of processed foods, there are many nutrient poor foods available – this means they don't contain the ingredients that your body needs to function. Rather, the food is full of energy (kilojoules) but are made up of "empty calories". The food will provide your body with energy (kilojoules) so you won't feel hungry, but it is void of essential nutrients that your body needs to function.

11 Most Nutrient Dense Foods:

- 1. **Salmon** Contains the greatest amount of Omega-3s. They provide the starting point for making hormones that regulate blood clotting, contraction and relaxation of artery walls, and inflammation.
- 2. **Kale** Is loaded with vitamins, minerals, fiber, antioxidants and various bioactive compounds.
- 3. **Seaweed** Is particularly high in minerals like Calcium, Iron, Magnesium and Manganese. It is also loaded with various bioactive compounds, including phycocyanins and carotenoids.
- 4. Garlic- Is high in vitamins C, B1 and B6, Calcium, Potassium, Copper, Manganese and Selenium.
- 5. **Shellfish** Clams are among the best sources of vitamin B12 in existence. It is also loaded with other nutrients, including Vitamin C, B-Vitamins, Potassium, Selenium and Iron. Oysters are also incredibly nutritious with healthy amounts of Zinc and Copper, along with large amounts of B12 and Vitamin D and a plethora of other nutrients.
- 6. **Potatoes** A single large potato contains lots of Potassium, Magnesium, Iron, Copper and Manganese with plenty of vitamin C and most of the B vitamins.
- 7. **Sardines** Small, oily fish like sardines are usually eaten whole, which includes the organs, bones, brains and other nutritious parts. They contain a little bit of almost every nutrient we need.
- 8. Liver- The liver is a remarkable organ with hundreds of functions related to metabolism. One of its functions is to store important nutrients for the rest of the body.
- 9. **Blueberries** They are loaded with powerful antioxidant substances, including anthocyanins and various phytochemicals, some of which can cross the bloodbrain barrier and exert protective effects on the brain.
- 10. Egg Yolks- They are high in Lutein and Zeaxanthine, antioxidants that can protect the eyes and reduce your risk of eye diseases like cataracts and macular degeneration. Eggs are also loaded with choline, a brain nutrient that about 90% of people aren't getting enough of.
- 11. Dark Chocolate- There are multiple studies in humans showing that dark chocolate has powerful health benefits, including but not limited to improved blood flow, a lower blood pressure, reduced oxidized LDL and improved brain function.




