RAINY SEASON HAS ARRIVED

Keep Stormwater Drains Free of Debris

With the excessive, heavy and often persistent rainfall last week, Weston experienced localized flooding in areas throughout the City, including swales and low-lying roadways.



Swales hold water during and immediately after a storm, but with continual rain it will take the water longer to drain. Weston's water bodies and canals were also designed to hold and move stormwater; however, heavy rain storms in a short span of time can cause temporary street flooding and elevated lake levels as the intricate drainage system handles the increased capacity of water. Watch Prevent Street Flooding.

Local flooding will more likely occur when catch basin, or storm drain, is clogged. A catch basin is designed to trap debris, such as leaves, palm fronds, litter, etc. so that it cannot enter the drainage pipes. Unobstructed water flow through these drains, especially during heavy rain, is essential to prevent flooding.

Keep Catch Basins Clear

Know where the nearest catch basin is to your home or business and check it frequently to keep it free of debris, especially after it



rains. It is recommended to keep your property free of loose items like leaves, branches, and palm fronds which will clog drains, especially during the rainy season.

Elevated Lake Levels

Lake levels will be higher than normal as the lakes receive rainwater runoff for which they were designed. An intricate system of stormwater pump stations operate to move the water through the South Florida Water Management distribution system. Higher than usual lake levels will gradually return to normal as rains subside and the water moves through the system. During heavy rains, City crews operate pumping systems at the maximum allowable levels.

WESTON RECEIVES DISTINGUISHED BUDGET PRESENTATION AWARD



WESTON: A PURPLE HEART CITY

Honoring the service and sacrifice of veterans wounded or killed



The Military Order of the Purple Heart was chartered by an act of Congress, to foster an environment of goodwill among the combat-wounded veteran members and their families.



The Purple Heart is awarded to any member of the United States Armed Services wounded or killed in combat with a declared enemy of the U.S. now including certain kinds of domestic terrorist activities.

A Purple Heart City

On June 5, 2017, the City Commission presented a proclamation to Mr. Lewis Colon, of the Military Order of the Purple Heart, declaring the City of Weston, Florida, a Purple Heart City.



Created by General George Washington in 1782 as a badge of honor and distinction, the Purple Heart has undergone numerous changes with respect to criteria for being awarded. The current Purple Heart medal was developed by General Douglas MacArthur in 1932, made in the shape of a rich purple heart bordered with gold and a bust of Washington in the center and the Washington coat-of-arms at the top. According to the Military Order of the Purple Heart, the heritage the medal represents is sacred to those who understand the price paid to wear it.

A Purple Heart City honors the service and sacrifice of our nation's men and women in the armed services, wounded or killed by the enemy,



serving to protect the freedoms our country enjoys. Mr. George Caffrey, Chair of the Veterans Coalition of the Elks Lodge presented the City with a flag, held by audience and Commission member veterans.



HEALTHY LIVING TIP SAFE SUN PRACTICES

Sun protection is important year-round in South Florida. As we head into summer, now is the time to fine tune our habits to minimize the damaging effects of sun exposure and reduce the risk of developing skin cancer, which is predominantly caused by overexposure to UV radiation.

- * The Right Sunscreen: Be sure to read the label to chose a sunscreen with broad spectrum protection (against both UVA and UVB rays) and with an SPF factor of 30 or higher. Some of the key ingredients include zinc oxide, titanium dioxide, ecamsule, and avobenzone (Parsol 1789). Check expiration dates to be sure it is still effective.
- Seek shade: Limit sun exposure by avoiding the outdoors or direct sunlight for long periods, especially during the hot summer months. UV light is strongest between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- ** Cover your skin: Clothes, especially fabric that has a UV protection factor (UPV), provide another layer of sun protection. Read the labels to find lightweight, comfortable clothing that offer UPV protection to cover up.
- ₩ear a hat: A hat, especially one that has a 2 3 inch brim all around is ideal, as it protects areas that are often exposed to intense sun, such as ears, forehead, nose and scalp.
- ** Sunglasses that block UV rays: The skin around the eyes, as well as the eyes themselves, need to be protected, too. Check the label to make sure the glasses block UV rays. If there is no label, do not assume sun protection is provided.

Sightseeing, sunbathing, skiing — who doesn't like a good vacation? But don't relax just yet.

Whether it's promising free or discounted trips, posting phony rental listings, or telling timeshare sellers they've got a buyer lined up, scammers are working to get a cut of your hard-earned travel money.

Here's what you need to know to avoid a scam.

AVOIDING SCAMS WHILE MAKING TRAVEL PLANS

The key to planning a good trip is making sure you're buying from travel businesses you know and trust:

Get Recommendations

Ask family and friends about the companies they use and like, and look online to see what people are saying about their service and prices.

Call to Verify Reservations and Arrangements

Get the details about any "five-star" resorts or "luxury" cruise ships they promise — including what other travelers have had to say about them.

Review the Company's Cancellation and Refund policies

before you pay for the trip, and ask "What if...?" Consider whether some form of travel cancellation insurance is appropriate.

Pay by Credit Card

It gives you more protection than paying by cash or check. If you don't get what you paid for, you may be able to dispute the charges with your credit card company

Consider Using a Travel App

Travel apps can help you search for airfares and hotel rates, get fare alerts and real-time deals, and manage your itinerary.
