## PUBLIC WORKS HELPS FIGHT AGAINST MOSQUITOES

Weston Public Works crews are placing mosquito larvicide briquets into all 1600 of the catch basins throughout the City. Catch basins are the grated storm drain structures along the sides of roadways into which rain water runs. This is a part of the stormwater drainage system. The grates catch larger debris, keeping it from entering the pipes which eventually lead to the lakes. There is a trap at the bottom which is periodically inspected and cleaned if needed.

City crews and contractors are placing a specially designed mosquito larvicide briquet into each of these catch basins. The NATULAR® XRT larvicide is an extended time-release product that lasts for 6 months, designed to kill mosquitoes in areas that hold water.

#### TIPS FOR RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES

#### Only Rain Down the Drain! An easy phrase to remember.

Unlike the water that goes down household drains to the sewer system, water that flows into storm drains is not treated or filtered for pollutants. This contaminated water flows into canals, and then into streams and lakes.

#### Help Keep Catch Basins Clear of Debris. Adopt a catch basin near you.

Clogged catch basins do not let water drain from the street and lead to flooding. If you see trash or debris cluttering the top of the catch basin grate or opening help out yourself and your community: remove the debris or notify your HOA Manager if you live in a managed property or call Public Works.

#### **GRILLING SAFETY:**

- Always supervise a barbecue grill when in use.
- Use long-handled tools especially made for cooking on the grill to keep the chef safe.
- Never add charcoal starter fluid when coals have already been ignited.
- Make sure everyone, including pets, stays away from the grill.

#### **BEACH SAFFTY:**

- Monitor local weather conditions. Be aware of potential lightning hazards.
- Check to see if any warning signs or flags are posted.
- Swim sober and always swim with a buddy.
- Protect the neck don't dive headfirst. Walk carefully into open waters.

#### Keep Your Furry Friends Safe During Holiday Activities



In the midst of awe inspiring firework shows and large holiday gatherings of family and friends, it's easy to forget the smallest member of the family. The upcoming Fourth of July weekend is one of the busiest times of the year for lost pets. Due to their sensitive hearing, your pet will likely be frightened and try to escape. It's natural to want to include your pet in activities, but the best celebration will be one where your pet is comfortable and safe.

#### **Holiday Safety Tips for Pets:**

Don't take your dog to places where there may be **fireworks**; keep all pets inside the house away from fireworks and loud noises. Do not leave them out in the yard.

Keep your pet safely away from hot grills, charcoal and lighter fluid. Sunscreen, insect repellant, citronella candles are also harmful to your pet.

Do not feed your pet "people food" or alcohol.

If your pet ingests a poisonous substance, contact your veterinarian right away or the Animal Poison Control Center at 1-888-426-4435.

Make sure your dog or cat has a **Broward County Pet Registration Tag** and that it wears this identification at all times. If your pet has a microchip, make sure the chip is registered to your current address and phone number.



#### **Hurricane Preparedness**

Remember the saying "the first 72 is on you". You need water, food and supplies to last your family for at least 3 days following a storm's impact to South Florida.

Electricity, gas, water and telephones may not be working. In addition, public safety services such as police and fire may not be able to reach you immediately following a serious disaster.

Prepare your home and your family to be able to live without running water, electricity, internet, gas, and telephones for at least three days following a disaster.

# KNOW YOUR RIGHTS! PRESCRIPTIONS FOR EYEGLASSES & CONTACTS

#### The Federal Trade Commission Reminds You of Your Consumer Rights for Eyeglass and Contact Lens Prescriptions

If you get a fitting for glasses or contact lenses, the eye doctor must give you a copy of your prescription – whether you ask for it or not. It's the law. The doctor can not require you to pay an extra fee, buy eyeglasses or contact lenses, or sign a waiver or form in order to receive the prescription.

### Why would I want my prescription for glasses or contacts?

As a consumer, you have a choice. You do not have to buy glasses or contacts from your eye doctor. You can use the prescription to buy glasses or contacts wherever they are sold – from an eye doctor, from a store, or online. Cost, quality and styles can vary.

# The doctor's office says they can't release my prescription because of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPPA).

HIPAA does not prohibit the release of a glasses or contact lens prescription to a patient.

## The information required in a prescription for glasses is determined by state law.

Your eye doctor may provide your pupillary distance – the distance between your pupils. If you want to buy glasses online, you need that measurement. Many doctors do not charge for the pupillary distance measurement. If your doctor charges for it, some online sellers may refund the cost.

## Can the doctor make me pay for the exam or fitting before providing my prescription?

The doctor can, and probably will, charge for the eye exam or contact lens fitting. However, the only way the eye doctor's office can require you to pay for the eye exam, contact lens fitting, or evaluation before giving you a copy of your prescription is if they require immediate payment from all eye exam patients.
