Solar Charging Stations for Small Electronics

The Weston Parks and Receation Department is always looking for ways to enhance the experience at Weston parks. Their newest feature: **Solar Charging Stations!** A total of ten total Rapid-Charge USB ports at each station can charge phones, tablets or small electronic devices. There is no cost to the user and the station is powered by the sun.

We have all had that moment when the phone battery is nearing the end, but our outing is not. Park visitors, and certainly sports participants are no different, spending hours at practices and games or enjoying the playground. Don't let a low battery indicator get you down. Kids and parents alike can power up to ensure you

Two solar charging stations are already installed in two parks, with the third to be in place in the next few weeks. The City's three main athletic parks, the most heavility utilized, are receiving the charging stations. The solar charging poles by Sun Charges Systems, Inc., are a versatile design which includes a 30" table to comfortably place your items, with eight rapid-charge ports surrounding the pole. There is a dedicated accessible port under the table.

KNOW THE HAZARDS

STORM SURGE

The most dangerous element of a hurricane is the storm surge – a dome of ocean water that can be 20 feet high at its peak and up to 100 miles wide. Nine out of 10 hurricane fatalities are attributed to storm surge.

EXTREME WIND

An Extreme Wind Warning will be issued if sustained winds of 115 mph or greater are expected to begin in a specific area within the hour.

RAIN

Hurricanes are storms comprised of wind and rain, which can be heavy and lead to isolated floods as well as flash floods.

Check your local forecast at the National Weather Service at Weather.gov.

Hurricane Preparedness – A Continuing Series STORM WATCH VS. WARNING

Before a storm threatens South Florida, it's best to know the lingo so that you can best prepare your home, family and business for the storm's possible affects.



As a storm develops it can intensify or weaken to a Tropical Storm before landfall. Although weaker than hurricanes, tropical storms are still a threat to be taken seriously.

Tropical Storm Watch

A tropical cyclone containing sustained winds of 39-73 mph is *possible* in the next 48 hours.

Tropical Storm Warning

A tropical cyclone containing sustained winds of 39-73 mph is expected in the next 36 hours.

Hurricane Watch

Hurricane conditions (a tropical cyclone containing sustained winds of 74 mph or more) are *possible* within 48 hours. A watch let's you know that conditions are favorable for a hazard to occur and allows you to prepare.

Hurricane Warning

Hurricane conditions are <u>expected</u> within 36 hours. A warning is an urgent message that indicates that a weather hazard is imminent.

Classes for the August 26th SAT Exam begin June 18th

As the school year heads into the final semester, those students planning to take the SAT in August can begin preparing for the exam by enrolling in the 8-week class offered at the Weston Community Center and led by Instructor Jeff Steinberg. BE SMART WHEN IT COMES TO WATER ACTIVITIES DESIGNATE A WATER WATCHER

Water activities are popular year-round in South Florida, whether it is simply swimming at a friend's house or at the community pool, boating on a lake, or fishing near the water's edge, such activities should ALWAYS be supervised by a **Water Watcher**, an adult who agrees to **pay** <u>undivided attention</u> to children in or near the water. A simple pool party can turn tragic if someone is not designated to watch the water.

Water Watchers are crucial in an area of the country with a high risk of drowning. Broward County, home to over 130,000 backyard pools and miles of waterways, has an average of eight drownings annually among children ages 1 – 4. "The number one thing you can do to prevent drowning is have a qualified adult watching the children at all times," says Dr. Paula Thaqi, Director of the Florida Department of Health in Broward County.

Water Watchers do not need special training but must be able to swim and ideally should be able to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). "Too often, many adults are in the area where children are swimming, but no one is really watching them," Thaqi says. "A drowning can occur in as little as two minutes."



At your next pool or lakeside gathering, designate an adult who agrees to:

- Face the children in the water at all times
- Never engage in distractions such as texting, talking, drinking, eating, internet browsing or socializing, while watching the children
- Never leave the children alone, unless he/she is relieved by an adult Water Watcher
- Continually scan the surface and bottom of the water
- Have a throwing device, reaching device, signaling device and a phone at hand
- · Be positioned to reach every child within 20 seconds
- Think ahead, know pool safety rules
- · Wear swim attire and be ready to launch a rescue

LARGER GATHERINGS: In larger groups of children, more than one **Water Watcher** may be needed. If the group is very large, consider hiring a lifeguard for the event.



CYBERSECURITY FOR SMALL BUSINESS OWNERS

Tips from the Federal Trade Commission

Running a small business is a big deal. The Federal Trade Commission offers tips and resources for small business owners to protect their interests. When it comes to cybersecurity, technology is dynamic and staying ahead of the curve can be a challenge. Here are a few computer security basics for business owners to keep in mind. Be sure to train your employees to follow these tips, as well.

PROTECT COMPUTER FILES & EQUIPMENT

Keep software updated. Set operating system software, browsers and applications to update automatically so you do not leave files unprotected.

Back up your files. Create offline backups of your system and important files regularly.

Use strong passwords. It is recommended to use long passwords – at least 12 characters – that have a mix of numbers, symbols and capital letters. Keep passwords locked away if you write them down.

Activate two-factor authentication when possible. This will require not only a password, but an additional piece of information to log in to your account. It may include a code sent to your phone, a series of personal questions or a number generated by an app.

Never leave your laptop, phone or other devices unattended in public. If these items are stolen, your identity will be, too. DO NOT leave laptops or phones in your vehicle. Password protect all devices.

PROTECT YOUR WIRELESS NETWORK

Change the name of your router (a.k.a. the service set identifier or SSID) and the pre-set password. Do not use the default name; change it to something unique.



Keep the router's software updated. Register your router with the manufacturer to be sure you get the latest updates.

Turn off any "remote management" features. Hackers can use them, too.

Log out as administrator. Otherwise, you are leaving the door wide open for someone to access your system, whether by accident or on purpose.
