Weston's newly elected Commissioner Byron L. Jaffe was administered the Oath of Office by Judge Michele Towbin Singer with his wife, Beth, and son, Benjamin, by his side at the March 20th City Commission meeting (his daughter, Hannah, was not able to attend.)

Commissioner Jaffe was elected on March 14th to fill the vacancy in Seat 3 of the City Commission. He will serve out that seat's term, which expires in November 2018.

A commercial pilot for American Airlines since 1985, Commissioner Jaffe offered up clever remarks following the oath that alluded to his flight experience, summarizing that he is proud to join his colleagues on the dais "not as the captain, but as part of the team that runs this great City".



URGENT AIRBAG RECALL NOTIFICATION

Nearly 70 million Takata airbag inflators, in approximately 42 million vehicles, are or will be under recall in the United States by 2019. While the recall includes vehicles made by 19 automakers, the Hondas and Acuras pictured below pose the most urgent threat — with up to a 50% chance of rupture upon deployment. These vehicles are unsafe to drive for any reason.



**The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration has hired an independent monitor in each state to assist in educating the public and finding the most dangerous vehicles on the road first.

The vehicles listed here are the oldest and most dangerous.

NEW MOM CHECKLIST



General Bathtub Safety:

- Never leave your child alone around water, not even for a few seconds, not even to answer the phone, door, or to get something.
 . Take the child with you!
- Never leave a baby or toddler in a bathtub under the care of another child.
- Always keep an infant or young child within arm's reach in a bathtub to support them if they slip or fall.
- Use non-skid decals or a mat inside the tub to prevent slipping.
- Use toys in the tub to keep your child busy and sitting down, and away from the faucet.
- Keep the temperature of your water heater below 120°F to prevent burns.
- Unplug all electric items, such as hair dryers and radios.
- Empty the tub immediately.
- Keep the floor and your child's feet dry to prevent slipping.
- Prepare ahead: have towel, shampoo, wash cloth at hand before starting the bath.



Water SMART Mom Checklist

- Learn CPR it can be a lifesaver when seconds count.
- Enroll your child into swim classes, commit to attending each lesson.
- Maintain constant eye-to-eye contact; only trust responsible adults to supervise in your absence.
- Keep infant and children within arm's reach at all times when around water.
- Do not use bath seats, flotation devices or swimming ability as a substitute for adult supervision.
- Install door & window alarms that access to pools, spas and all other bodies of water.

SAT PREP COURSE OFFERED AT WESTON COMMUNITY CENTER



Classes for the June 3, 2017 SAT Test begin April 9th

As the school year heads into the final semester, those students planning to take the SAT in June can begin preparing for the exam by enrolling in the 8-week class offered at the Weston Community Center and led by Instructor Jeff Steinberg.
