WESTON EXPLORERS ATTEND STATE TRAINING



A group from the BSO Weston Police Explorers Post 44 participated in the Florida Association of Police Explorers Delegate Training from April 28th – 30th. The training was hosted by the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office and the St. Petersburg Police Department on the campus of St. Petersburg College.

Weston Post 44 participated in building clearing, search & seizure, domestic scenarios, and hands-on training in cell extraction, first-

aid & K-9 operations in over 20 individual training areas.

Over 300 participants participated in the training, from as far north as Tallahassee to neighboring Broward Posts from Miramar & Coral Springs. The trainings are conducted on a quarterly basis to prepare for the State Competition, which will be hosted by the Palm Beach Gardens Police Department this summer.

The BSO Law Enforcement Explorer Program is for young men and women ages 14 - 21. The program allows participants to interact with law enforcement and other community advisors in a serious, regimented atmosphere where the students can demonstrate their personal initiative.

Hundreds Participate in Household Hazardous Waste and Electronics Recycling Events



The official totals are in and Weston residents responded overwhelmingly to this year's two Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) and Electronics Recycling collection events held on February 12th and April 30th. The turnout in Weston continues to be much greater than anticipated, as 1276 residents participated by disposing household waste at one of the two events.

Here is a glimpse at some of the items collected at the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events in Weston this year:

• 37,980 Latex paint

• 2,464 Lead acid batteries

• 1,840 Motor Oil

• 2,999 Corrosive liquids / solids (C8)

• 2,392 Flammable liquids / solids (C3, 4.1)

• 268 Fire extinguishers

All items are reported in pounds. Liquids equal approximately 8 lbs. / gallon.

In total, 87,621 pounds of HHW items were collected in Weston in 2017.

In addition to Household Hazardous Waste, the event provides residents the opportunity to recycle electronics. This year, **Weston residents recycled** 33,808 electronics at the two collection events.



The Household Hazardous Waste collection event is hosted regularly by Broward County in various municipalities. If you missed these recent opportunities, don't worry! Weston residents can visit any of the County's drop-off locations which are open on Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. For a list of items accepted at the locations – which includes household chemicals and electronics – as well as other details, <u>click here</u> to visit Broward County's HHW webpage. The Water Quality Report is also known as the "Consumer Confidence Report", as the purpose of the report is to give the public confidence about their tap water.





Have a Conversation with Your Teen

The Superintendent of Broward County Public Schools, Robert Runcie, issued a letter to parents on May 8th addressing an increase in media attention regarding disturbing trends in teen mental health, self-harm and suicide. This is due to a popular Netflix series, 13 Reasons Why, that chronicles the struggles of a teenage girl and her tragic decision to commit suicide, as well as web-based games (such as Blue Whale) that appear to be harmless, yet entice teens to engage in dangerous, self-harming behavior.

Parents are encouraged to monitor their child's viewing choices and online activities and to talk with your child daily.

If you think something is not right, do not hesitate to reach out for help. There is no shame in contacting a professional to assist you or a loved one through a difficult time. Dial 2-1-1, your first call for help to inquire about services available or to be put in contact with a variety of providers that offer vital services for Broward residents of all ages and situations.

Encourage healthy living and prevent a tragedy. It starts with a conversation.







DROWNING PREVENTION BEGINS WITH LEARNING TO SWIM



Drowning is the fifth-leading cause of death in the United States. In Broward County, it is the leading cause of unintentional death among children ages 1 to 4.

Don't let yourself or a loved one become a part of this statistic by following this simple checklist:

- ☼ Learn how to swim. Formal swimming lessons can reduce the risk of drowning especially among children age 1 to 14. The Weston YMCA and other facilities throughout Broward honor the Swim Central coupon for children ages 6 months to 4 years old. A limited number of adult swim vouchers are also available. Click here to learn about the Adult swim voucher.
- ☼ Make pool safety something to brag about. Be sure to keep your pool area covered, install pool alarms and install a pool barrier. Be sure the barrier is always closed when not in use.
- ☼ Be a Water Watcher. There must always be a dedicated ADULT to supervise when children are near water, including the pool area, beach, backyard lakes, canals and even the bathtub.
- ☼ Not all heroes wear capes. Get CPR certified! The City of Weston offers free CPR lessons and certification. Contact BSO Weston Fire Rescue at 954-389-2015 today!

Residents can now properly dispose of old, tattered and torn flags at Broward County Government Center locations and other locations throughout the County. Through a partnership between the National Association of Counties, the National Flag Foundation and the National Sheriff's Association, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners is proud to provide flag retirement boxes in the facilities listed below.

The American flag is a symbol of our country, our people and the devotion we have to our nation. Not only does the American flag represent our great nation's freedom, but it is

a representation of our country's citizens and the history of this great nation. For those and many other reasons, it is important to respect the flag.

The disposal boxes offer residents a convenient and respectful way to dispose of their flags when they are no longer in condition that is fit for display.

Flags deposited in the boxes will be collected and disposed of properly and should be folded appropriately before being placed in the box. Only U.S. flags will be accepted.


