#### **#3 IN THE STATE OF FLORIDA**



The <u>SafeWise Report</u> was just issued in late October and its **20 Safest Cities in Florida 2017 Report** has the City of Weston ranked as *The #3 Safest City in Florida*!

What is particularly impressive is that the populations of the ranked cities are much lower than that of the City of Weston. Of the top ten cities, all others are under 29,000. This fact is even highlighted in the report:



There is a misconception that larger cities aren't as safe as smaller ones, which isn't always the case, and Weston—the third-ranked city on our list—proves it. With more than 70,000 residents, this Broward County community reported just twenty-six violent crimes.

The men and women of the Broward Sheriff's Office Weston, under the leadership of Chief Kevin Butler, are to be commended for this continued achievement in the face of population and commercial growth. Chief Butler stresses however, that a safe community still needs to be vigilant: locking car doors, ensuring vehicle key fobs are not left in the vehicle, closing your garage doors and keeping an eye out for suspicious individuals and calling 9-1-1 are all essential elements to keeping Weston safe.

# **BIKING NORTH ON WESTON ROAD?**

# Grant Funding Approved for Installation of New Bike Lanes

The City of Weston and the City of Sunrise each submitted an application to the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization's (MPO) Complete Streets and Other Localized Initiatives Program (CSLIP) for the construction of bicycle lanes on Weston Road from Indian Trace north to State Road 84. Earlier this month, the City of Weston was notified that the funding for the entire project has been approved.

The 1.7 mile segment will ensure that there will now be a dedicated bike lane along Weston Road from Griffin Road to State Road 84, which is one of the proposed route improvements that was outlined in the <u>City of Weston's Bicycle Master Plan</u> in 2013. The lane will also provide additional bicycle connectivity from the City of Weston to Broward County's Markham Park, located in Sunrise, just north of State Road 84.

In addition to this project, the City is applying to the CSLIP program for the construction of bike lanes on Bonaventure Boulevard from State Road 84 south to Indian Trace. A public open house was held for that project on November 7<sup>th</sup>. The application will be submitted to the MPO later this month.

#### **BSO SHRED-A-THON AND OPERATION MEDICINE CABINET**

The Broward Sheriff's Office will hold a Shred-A-Thon and Operation Medicine Cabinet prescription drug "take back" event on Saturday, November 18<sup>th</sup> in Weston.

The prescription drug take back program, operating under the name Operation Medicine Cabinet, allows participants to turn in unused or expired prescription medication to receive a \$5 gift card (while supplies last, limit one per family).

The Shred-A-Thon provides residents with a safe way to dispose of their personal documents, check stubs, credit card offers, receipts and any other paperwork that contains sensitive information. The service is free of charge. There's a limit of five boxes per person.

Boxes can be no larger than 15" L x 12" W x 10" H.

Documents destroyed at BSO's Shred-A-Thon events are shredded by SafeGuard Document Destruction.

# **EMERGENCY BUILDING REPAIRS**

Following a storm – a hurricane, tornado or even heavy rains – it is important to know the steps necessary to stabilize conditions and prevent further damage to your home and other property by attending to emergency building repairs.

# Survey Your Property for Damage and File a Claim



After the storm has passed and it is safe to do so, you should inspect your property for any damage. If you will be submitting an insurance claim, your adjuster will want to inspect the damage before a full repair is done. Be sure to take photos of all damage prior to doing any type of emergency repairs.

## If You Need Emergency Repairs Done to Your Home

Hire a licensed professional. Don't attempt to do a big renovation project on your own. Be sure they are properly licensed and insured to perform the necessary work in accordance with the Florida Building Code. Most repairs will require a permit and inspections by the City of Weston Building Department to ensure your safety and to maintain the integrity of your home.



## What is a Non-Disaster Type Emergency Repair?

Some repairs may be classified as an "emergency" even if it is not related to a disaster. For example, if an air conditioning unit fails and there is a chronically ill person in the home that requires air conditioning. A new unit can be installed prior to a permit being received, but it must be done by a licensed professional, with a permit pulled and the work inspected after completion.






