



Tips to Avoid Holiday Weight Gain

The holiday season has arrived. From Thanksgiving through the end of the year we will be tempted with good food, treats and sweets at home, at work and at gatherings among family and friends. So, what can we do to avoid the temptations that lead to unhealthy weight gain over the holiday season?



- Get moving! Regular sustained aerobic activity helps to maintain or lose weight. To burn off those extra calories over the holidays, increase your exercise routine. Increase your routine from 30 minutes a day to 45, or three times a week to five.
- Aim for seven-a-day. Eat seven or more servings of fruit or vegetables to help fill you up without adding many calories.
- Control the risk for temptation. Control your contact with tempting foods. It could be as simple as not keeping candy on your desk, or limiting treats to the breakroom.
- Limit one small serving of a cookie or piece of candy each day during the holiday season. Remember that you may have to compensate for it later in the day

by reducing your overall calories or by burning a few extra calories while exercising.

- Always plan, never go to a party hungry Eat a healthy snack before leaving for a holiday party.
- **Be in charge** of your party choices A small appetizer will help you avoid over-eating at dinner. For dinner, a good rule is to fill half of your plate with salad and vegetables, a quarter with meat and a quarter with starch. Skip seconds and choose your beverages wisely.
- Say No Politely To those that continually offer food, politely decline. "No thank you. Everything was delicious."
- Focus on socializing, conversation is calorie-free. Step away from the buffet and socialize.

Anchoring a New Basketball Hoop? Installing a Gazebo? New Fence? CALL 811 BEFORE YOU DIG



What Do the Colors Mean? See survey markings in your neighborhood? Here's what the marks mean:



After utilities are marked on your property, dig carefully around the area that is marked. It is recommended to avoid the "tolerance zone" which is 2' on either side of the marking.



Installing a fence or mailbox? Anchoring a new basketball hoop? If you are doing work in your yard that requires you to dig into the ground, be sure to call 811 to dig safely on your property. The service is free for the public and it's not just for contractors!

Safe digging is everyone's responsibility. Deciding to take a shortcut during weekend projects can lead to Internet and cable outages, injuries and sometimes worse. That's why it's so important – and it's the law – to have buried utilities in your yard located and marked before you dig.

How Do I Make My Request?

If you are planning to dig on your property, make a service request by:

- Calling 811 to make the request by phone
- Click here to open an online ticket

It usually takes up to 48 hours for all utilities located within your designated work area to respond to your property and make their marks. After the marks are done, you can safely work around the marked area with peace of mind that your work will not interfere with underground utilities.

BROWARD COUNTY LIBRARY LAUNCHES GoChip!

Go-Chip Gives Viewers a Full Season of TV in Their Hands



Binge watchers, rejoice! Broward County Library is now offering an innovative new device, the GoChip, that lets you stream hit TV shows to watch from a phone or other mobile device. The GoChip lets you take a full season of premiere TV shows such as Outlander, Breaking Bad and The Shield with you wherever you go. No more using up your data to watch your favorite programs, and you don't have to worry about slow Internet connections, re-buffering or error messages. You and your family/friends can also watch different episodes on eight different devices simultaneously.

The GoChip Beam is a small, rechargeable device, the size of a mini-flashlight, that holds an entire season of a television series and beams the content to personal devices without an Internet connection. Devices include PC and Mac laptops and iOS and Android mobile devices. You can now be able to realize the "access anywhere" promise of the Internet that bandwidth costs and geography have made difficult.

Broward County Libraries is the first library in Florida, the first in the Southeast and one of the first 12 libraries nationwide currently offering the GoChip to customers. You can check out a GoChip just as you would any other library materials. They can be checked out for seven days and you can renew twice, two days at a time, for a total of 11 days. Use your Broward County Library card to borrow a GoChip at this following library location closest to Weston:

SAFE FUN IN THE WATER YEAR-ROUND BE WATER SMART WESTON

Drowning is preventable. Taking the **Water Smart Pledge** will help you remember simple tips to help you and your family enjoy the water safely throughout the year.



Click to take the pledge

- ✓ Provide close and constant supervision of your child children can quickly leave a safe, supervised area and enter water unsupervised.
- ✓ **Designate a water watcher** when in and around water at all times, including family gatherings and house parties.
- ✓ Enroll your child into swim lessons; adults should also learn to swim.
- ✓ Learn CPR yourself and also for others that are likely to supervise your children in your absence. Don't know CPR? Plan to attend Weston's Community CPR Day with your children on February 10, 2018.
- ✓ Check your pool & sauna barriers to make sure they are in place properly. Remove ladders for above the ground pools when not in use. Ensure in-ground pools have four-sided fences and self-latching/closing gates. Saunas should be drained or covers should be secured when not in use.
- **✓** Empty portable pools when not in use.
- ✓ Ensure pools and saunas have safe drain covers.

TALK TO YOUR CHILDREN ABOUT BEING SAFE AROUND THE WATER

Never swim alone • Always make sure there is an adult or lifeguard supervising the water • Stay away from pool drains • learn to swim • I will have fun, but always make safe decisions when I am in and around water






