

2017 MAYOR OF THE YEAR AWARD

Weston Mayor Daniel J. Stermer was honored as *Mayor of the Year* by the Broward County Council of Professional Fire Fighters at their Annual Awards Dinner, held at the Nova Southeastern University Huizenga College of Business Atrium on August 26, 2017. The Broward County Council of Professional Fire Fighters (BCCPFF) represents over 2,500 professional firefighters and paramedics in Broward County.



HOW WESTON MANAGES STORMWATER

View An Informational Video





The City of Weston has a new informational video on how the City manages the stormwater within Weston.

Lakes throughout each community are owned and maintained by the City and divided into two separate basins: Indian Trace & Bonaventure. The lakes are part of an overall drainage system and were built to accommodate and store excess rainwater.

It takes time to lower the level of our city's lakes and waterways. The city operates its stormwater pumps under regulations from the South Florida Water Management District.

Drainage systems within private communities are the responsibility of the Home Owner Association. It's important that HOAs and residents do their part in helping to reduce street flooding by keeping storm drains and catch basins clear of debris, such as leaves, palm fronds, and other landscaping waste.

Learn how and where water within your community is pumped and what you can do to assist in keeping catch basins clear and water flowing.

BUSINESS TAX RECEIPT RENEWALS

DEADLINE TO RENEW IS SEPTEMBER 30TH

All businesses in Weston are required to have an active Business Tax Receipt (BTR) before engaging in any business transactions in the City of Weston. This includes home-based businesses.

Business Tax Receipts are due and payable on or before **September 30**th of each year, for October 1st through September 30th of the following year.

Renewal invoices were mailed out on July 1st to the mailing address we have on file. It is the responsibility of each business owner to notify the City should there be any changes.

Pursuant to Florida State Statute, Chapter 205, local Business Tax Receipts (BTR) that are not renewed by September 30th are delinquent and subject to a delinquency penalty of **10% for the month of October**, plus an **additional 5% penalty for each subsequent month** of delinquency until paid. Any person who engages in any business, occupation, or profession covered by this chapter, who does not pay the required business tax within 150 days after the initial notice of the tax due, and who does not obtain the required receipt, is subject to civil actions and penalties, including court costs, reasonable attorneys' fees, additional administrative costs incurred as a result of collection efforts, and a penalty of up to **\$250**.

Businesses that do business throughout Broward County may also be required to have a County BTR. Click here to access information on local business taxes from the Broward County Records, Taxes and Treasury Division, or call 3-1-1 for additional information.



BIG DOG ADOPTION

This Fall, from September 1st to November 17th, adopt a Big Dog (40 lbs. or more) and receive FREE pet supplies! Adopters can name their own adoption fee for all dogs. Fees for cats continue to be waived (including the Center's adoptable cats at Pet Supermarket stores located in Broward County). The \$20 non-refundable deposit applies to hold a stray/lost dog or cat.

All adoptions include spaying/neutering, all necessary vaccinations, a Broward County Rabies Registration License tag and a microchip!

DON'T FORGET ABOUT FIDO!

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS FOR PETS

As you make your hurricane plans for your family, remember to plan for your pet, too. Preparing a *Pet Survival Kit* is key to ensuring that you have enough food and important pet information on hand in case you lose power or must evacuate. Details are available from Ready.gov and from the Humane Society of Broward County.

It's best to gather supplies and put in a waterproof container with a secure plastic lid, along with a a crate or carrier large enough for your pet to stand and turn:

- Leashes and collars
- Two-week supply of moist or dry food, with manual can opener
- Two-week supply of bottled water (or more if using dry food)
- Water and food dishes
- Extra cat litter, litter pan and puppy training pads (consider the fact that your dog may not be able to "potty" outside during or after a storm)
- Emergency phone numbers for veterinarian, animal shelters, friends or relatives
- Veterinary clinic address and phone number
- Veterinary records with rabies certificate and current Broward County Pet Registration Tag number
- Medications with instructions (ensure you have enough medication on hand before the storm hits)
- Cleaning supplies (newspaper, plastic bags with ties, paper towels, disinfectant)
- A photo of you and your pet together (to help prove the pet is yours), and a photo of the pet by itself, showing any distinguishing marks that will help with identification.

Pet Friendly Shelter: If you plan to evacuate to a shelter with your pet, it is recommended to register in advance with the Humane Society of Broward County at 954-989-3977. Broward County operates one pet-friendly shelter that is available on a first-come, first-serve basis during a storm activation.

WATER SMART RESPONDING TO A DROWING IN PROGRESS

If you see a swimmer in distress, you will notice that the individual may still try to swim, but makes little or no forward progress, which causes panic. As a bystander, you can help, if you take action swiftly and you remain calm. CPR is a lifesaving tool in this instance.

An active drowning victim may be:

- o Vertical in the water, but unable to move forward or tread water.
- o Pressing down with their arms at the side to attempt to push the

An inactive drowning victim is motionless on the surface or bottom of the water



Responding to Drowning

• If you are alone with the victim, remain calm. Immediately remove the victim from the water **if you can do so safely**. DO NOT put yourself in a dangerous situation.

If you know CPR:

- If someone is nearby, yell for help to call 9-1-1 while you safely remove the victim from the water and begin CPR.
- If you are alone and the victim is a child, remove him/her from the water and begin CPR for the first for two minutes, then call 9-1-1.

If you do not know CPR:

• Call 9-1-1 immediately and they will instruct you once they dispatch Emergency Medical Services.
