FORUM ON SCHOOL SAFETY

In response to the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School tragedy, Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) is holding a **Forum on School Safety** on **Wednesday, April 18, 2018**. The Forum takes place at **Plantation High School**, located at 6901 NW 16 Street, Plantation, Florida 33313, from **6:30 – 8:30 PM**. Doors open at 6 PM.

During the Forum, Broward County School Board members, BCPS Superintendent Robert W. Runcie and District leadership will provide information and updates regarding school safety measures, state funding, mental health services and programs, counseling and support services for students and employees, and the SMART initiative as it pertains to school safety.

The Forum on School Safety is open to the public and will be streamed live on the District's website, www.BrowardSchools.com.

APRIL BULK TRASH PICKUP STARTS TOMORROW April 2018

Time for some spring cleaning? Clean out your garage, closets, and storage sheds in time for this month's **Residential Bulk Pickup**, which occurs quarterly throughout the year. Pickup takes place on your **regularly scheduled garbage collection day this week**.

April 2018:

Single Family Homes and Multi-Family Units with curbside collection

On the day of your regularly scheduled garbage collection: Wednesday, April 18th; Thursday, April 19th or Friday, April 20th

Multi-family units with dumpsters Saturday, April 21st

Bulk items include but are not limited to:

- Furniture, mattresses, carpets and large household items.
- Large and small appliances, such as dishwashers, laundry machines and stoves.
- Refrigerators or air conditioners must have Freon removed by a certified dealer.
- Mirrors, glass, glass top tables, windowpanes, and plate glass items should be safely placed in a rigid container.
- Vegetative/lawn waste generated by the homeowner



NOT COLLECTED: Bulk items DO NOT include contractor-generated material (including vegetative waste generated by a lawn or tree service) or household hazardous waste. **Dispose of Household Hazardous Waste at our next HHW event on April 29**th.



THINK BEFORE YOU TRASH – CONSIDER DONATING ITEMS

Help those in need, keep items out of the waste stream, **and** get a tax deduction. Several national organizations will even pick up directly from your residence.

Simply drive up and drop off your household hazardous waste and electronic items off. Crews will remove items from your vehicle for you. Click for more information.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) refers to used or leftover contents of consumer products that contain chemicals with one of the four characteristics: *Toxic, Ignitable, Corrosive, or Reactive* as defined by the Environmental Protection Agency.



What items are accepted?

Items include paints, thinners, pesticides, fertilizers, pool chemicals, motor oil, tires, mercury, batteries, and light bulbs as well as electronics including old televisions, computers, keyboards, printers, stereos, copiers, and phones. QUARTERLY RESIDENTIAL BULK TRASH PICKUP

The Quarterly Residential Bulk Trash Pickup will occur in January on your regularly scheduled garbage collection day as follows.

Single Family & Multi-family with curbside collection:

Wednesday, April 18, Thursday, April 19 OR Friday, April 20

Multi-Family with dumpsters ("Containerized Service"): Saturday, April 21

FREE Bulk Pickup will take place on your regularly scheduled garbage collection day and all items should be curbside by 7 a.m.

Bulk items include but are not limited to:

- Furniture, mattresses, carpets and other large household items.
- Large and small appliances, such as dishwashers, laundry machines and stoves.
- Refrigerators or air conditioners must have Freon removed by a certified dealer.
- Mirrors, glass, glass top tables, windowpanes, and plate glass items should be safely placed in a rigid container to facilitate safe collection.
- Customer-generated vegetative debris (tree branches must be 6" in diameter or less).
