SAFEST CITIES WESTON RANKED #2 IN FLORIDA

The [National Council for Home Safety and Security](#) just issued its **Safest Cities in Florida 2018 Report** has the City of Weston ranked as *The #2 Safest City in Florida!*

What is particularly impressive is that the populations of the ranked cities are much lower than that of the City of Weston. Of the top ten cities, all others are under 40,000.



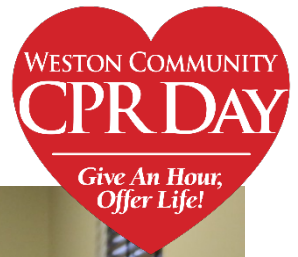
There is a misconception that larger cities aren't as safe as smaller ones, which isn't always the case, and Weston—ranked second on the list—proves it. With more than 70,000 residents, this Broward County community reported just thirty-six violent crimes.

The men and women of the Broward Sheriff's Office Weston, under the leadership of Chief Kevin Butler, are to be commended for this continued achievement in the face of population and commercial growth. Chief Butler stresses however, that a safe community still needs to be vigilant: locking car doors, ensuring vehicle key fobs are not left in the vehicle, closing your garage doors and keeping an eye out for suspicious individuals and calling 9-1-1 are all essential elements to keeping Weston safe.

Hands-Only CPR, AED & Heimlich



Just over 300 people were trained in hands-only CPR on Saturday, February 10th at the Weston Community CPR Day. The event was a huge success. Staff from the Broward Sheriff's Office Department of Fire Rescue & Emergency Services and Cleveland Clinic Florida provided the training to anyone eight and over.

Dr. Roach, Chairman and Medical Director of the Emergency Department at Cleveland Clinic Florida and for the Broward Sheriff's Office was on-hand to offer his expertise and oversight. The fact that an eight-year old can be taught hands-only CPR is a testament to how simple, yet effective the procedure is.



WESTON COMMUNITY CPR DAY **A HUGE SUCCESS – JUST OVER 300 TRAINED** **Hands-Only CPR, AED & Heimlich**

The City of Weston, BSO Fire Rescue and Cleveland Clinic Florida teamed up to offer Weston Community CPR Day because of the importance of training as many people as possible in hands-only CPR. Approximately 95% of cardiac arrest victims die before reaching a hospital or care facility. Most people who survive a cardiac emergency or drowning are helped by bystander CPR prior to the arrival of professionals. This can TRIPLE their chance of survival.

Hands-Only CPR is Easy and it is Effective.

Steps for Hands-Only CPR:

- 1) Call 9-1-1
- 2) Check to see if the person is breathing, if not:
- 3) Press hard and fast in the center of the chest, continuously, until emergency personal take over.

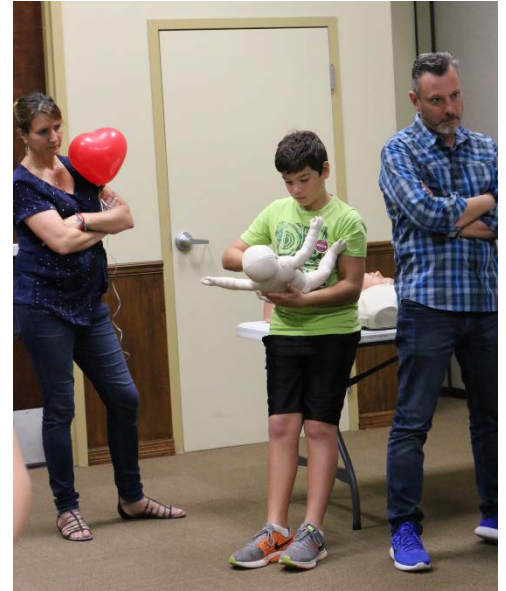
Using two hands, in the center of the chest at the nipple line, use your upper body weight (not just your arms) as you push straight down on the chest at least 2 inches, doing compressions for an adult or teen.

Soccer Fields #1 & #2 Open and In Use



The soccer fields in Weston Regional Park have a demand for play time that outpaces the lifespan of the turf. The wear and tear of heavy use takes its toll on even the most well-maintained fields. Fields #1 and #2 will no longer have this issue. Replaced with an artificial turf that has an organic infill, these fields are ready for year-round play!

There are numerous benefits to artificial turf, particularly for active fields. Artificial turf can also be played on during wet conditions; they require far less maintenance than grass; they will not develop holes and divots; and they increase capacity. The two fields at Regional will mainly be utilized for soccer and flag football which was evident this past Saturday.

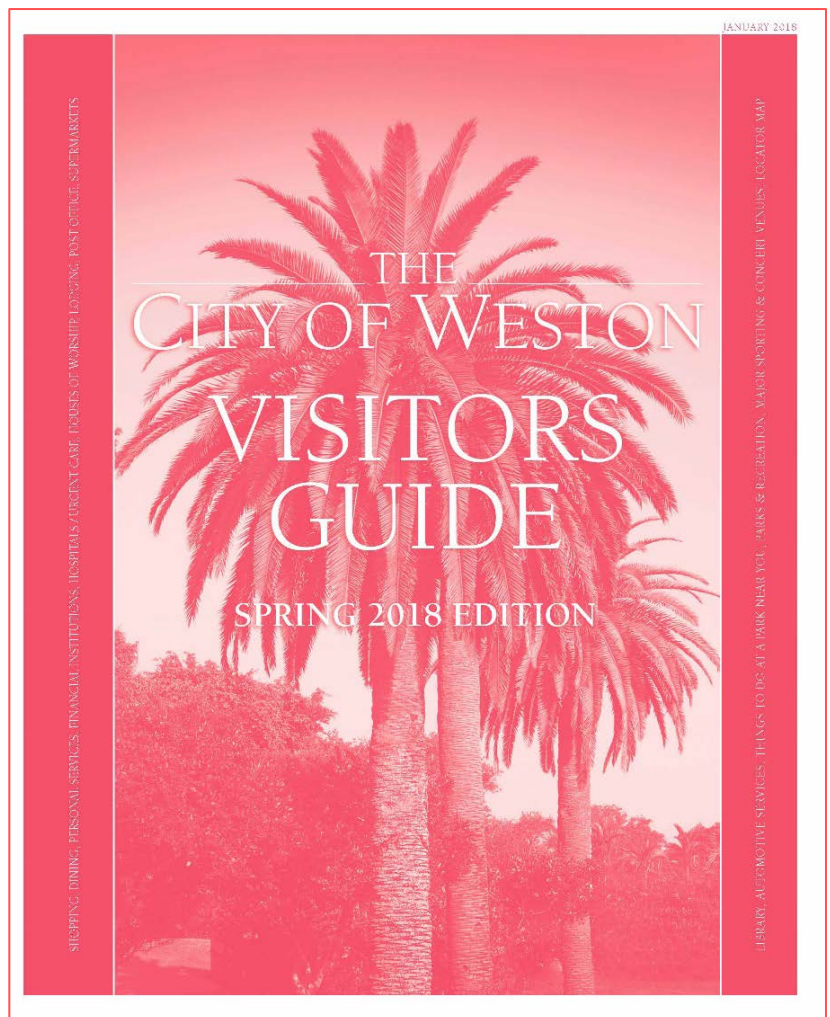

BORN IN BROWARD? LIFELONG LIBRARY CARD

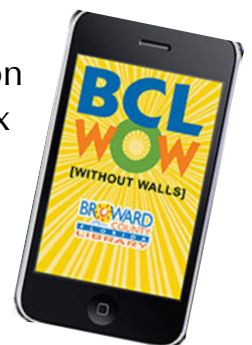
If you were born in Broward County, the Broward County Libraries Division has a program that grants every Broward native a lifelong library card as a birthright – no matter where you reside in the world now!

SKY LANTERNS PROHIBITED FIRE DANGER

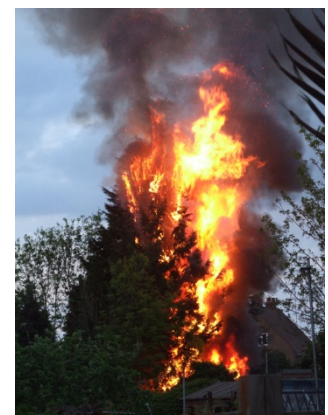


Sky lanterns, also known as Chinese lanterns or Wish lanterns are beautiful. But use of these air-borne lanterns is illegal in Broward County as well as many areas around the country and the world. They are a significant fire and wildfire risk, and environmentally unfriendly.

The use of Sky Lanterns is prohibited in Broward County, as per the Broward County Board of Rules and Appeals Amendments to the Fire Prevention Code.

Safety Awareness: Sky Lanterns, once ignited and released, become an uncontrolled, flying ignition source, whose direction of travel is dependent on the wind direction, which can change unpredictably.

- **The lanterns are made of oiled rice paper with a bamboo frame, materials that easily catch fire.**
- **A candle or wax fuel cell is used with the device.**
- **The lit flame heats the inside of the lantern, causing it to rise in the air.**
- **Once lit and airborne, it can travel over a mile in distance.**
- **These lanterns have the potential to cause fires. A flaming lantern can drop onto a rooftop, trees, brush, or power lines before the flame is fully extinguished.**
- **A destructive fire can result when a flaming lantern lands during dry conditions.**
- **The remaining lantern parts are a risk for wildlife, become litter and are not environmentally friendly.**

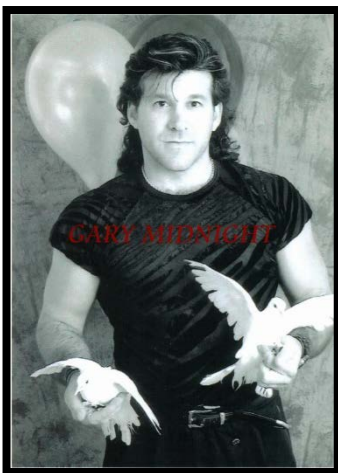

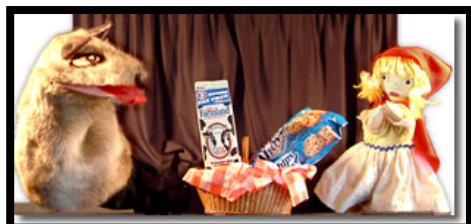

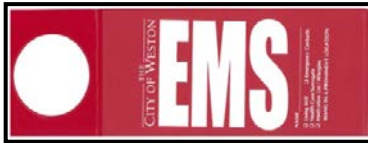
