Other Tips to Avoid the Spread of Influenza

Practice good hygiene by properly and frequently washing your hands to help prevent the spread of seasonal flu. Clean and disinfect commonly used surfaces in your home, school or office. Cover your cough or sneeze into a tissue or your elbow and avoiding touching your face.


Health Department Recommends Flu Shots

As flu season is now in full swing, influenza activity across the state. The Florida has increased of Health Broward County Department in recommends that if you have not already gotten the flu vaccine to get it. It will still be effective to protect against infection and will also help prevent the spread of seasonal flu to others. Although most cases of flu are mild, there are exceptions.



The Health Department strongly encourages everyone 6 months and older, including pregnant women, to get vaccinated against the flu.

Groups at high risk for severe illness include children, pregnant women, those with underlying chronic conditions and people over the age of 65. The annual flu vaccine is safe and is the most effective way to protect yourself. It takes about two weeks after vaccination for your body to develop protection against the flu.

USPS ANNOUCES NEW POSTAGE PRICES

EFFECTIVE JANUARY 21, 2018


The United States Postal Service (USPS) announced rate changes to its shipping and mailing services that will go into effect on January 21, 2018.

Most notably, the 1-cent increase for both single-piece stamped, and metered letters will maintain the 3-cent discount mailers can expect to receive when they opt for metered mail over stamped mail.

Here are more details on the changes:

First-Class Mail Rate Changes

- First-Class Mail Stamped Letters (1 oz.): \$0.49 to \$0.50
- First-Class Mail Metered Letters (1 oz.): \$0.46 to \$0.47
- Domestic Postcards: \$0.34 to \$0.35
- First-Class Mail Flats (1 oz.): \$0.98 to \$1.00





*FOREVER Stamp Reminder: Forever® stamps can always be used for First-Class® mail up to one ounce, regardless of the current one-ounce rate.

Replace: Rice

Sour cream has 2x the calories. Greek yogurt has nearly 3x the protein.



Replace: Potato Chips



Air-Popped Popcorn

Air-popped popcorn has 9x less saturated fat and has 1/3 fewer calories per serving.







Cacao Nibs

Cacao nibs have no sugar and over 5x the fiber of regular chocolate chips.

QUARTERLY RESIDENTIAL BULK TRASH PICKUP

The Quarterly Residential Bulk Trash Pickup will occur in January on your regularly scheduled garbage collection day as follows.

Single Family & Multi-family with curbside collection:

Wednesday, January 17; Thursday, January 18; OR Friday, January 19

Multi-Family with dumpsters ("Containerized Service"): Saturday, January 20

Place items out curbside by 7 a.m. on your regular garbage service day during the posted dates. Bulk Waste service is not to exceed 6 cubic yards of waste per residential household unit.

Bulk items include, but are not limited to:

- Furniture, mattresses, carpet and other large household items.
- Large and small appliances, such as dishwashers, laundry machines and stoves.
- Refrigerators or air conditioners must have Freon removed by a certified dealer.

CONTINUED QUARTERLY RESIDENTIAL BULK TRASH PICKUP

- Mirrors, glass, glass top tables, windowpanes, and plate glass items should be safely placed in a rigid container to facilitate safe collection.
- Customer-generated vegetative debris (tree branches must be 6" in diameter or less).






