

#### FAMILY HEIRLOOM RETURNED

#### **DUE TO PERSISTANT DETECTIVE**

In April of 2016, Richard Martino, Jr. was renting an apartment in the San Messina Community of Weston. While living there, a New York State Trooper Police Academy Ring was taken from his vehicle.

The ring belonged to his father who attended the Police Academy back in 1986. His father, Richard Martino has since retired from the State Police yet still resides in upstate

New York. The ring was a gift to his son Richard. Richard did not report the ring stolen, however he and his family were disappointed about losing the heirloom.

In April of 2017, BSO Detective Chris Bradley while on patrol stopped a suspect in the San Messina parking lot. The suspect had the ring in his pocket. The suspect admitted he stole the ring from a vehicle, however he could not remember where or when he stole it.

Detective Bradley initiated an investigation to locate the owner of the ring. For the next eight months, Detective Bradley worked with the New York State Police Academy, the NY Retired Trooper Association and other law Enforcement associations to try to locate the owner of the ring which had the initials of "RM" engraved inside.

On January 2, 2018, Detective Bradley was contacted by Richard Martino Jr. who reported the ring was stolen from his vehicle two years prior. The family was overjoyed to be reunited with the ring which meant a lot to the father and son.

### FAMILY HEIRLOOM RETURNED DUE TO PERSISTANT DETECTIVE

On January 4, 2018, Richard Martino, Jr. and his son Marris, arrived at the Weston District Office to collect the Police Academy ring. But the story doesn't end there. Detective Bradley filed a warrant for the arrest of the suspect who admitted stealing the ring from an unknown vehicle.

This story has a happy ending due to the persistence of BSO Detective Bradley who would not quit until he found the rings rightful owner.

Are you looking forward to getting your tax refund in the new year? Tax identity thieves may be looking forward to getting your refund too. That's why the FTC has designated January 29-February 2, 2018 as Tax Identity Theft Awareness Week.

Tax identity theft happens when someone uses your Social Security number (SSN) to get a tax refund or a job. You might find out it's happened when you e-file your tax return and discover that a return already has been filed using your SSN. The IRS may send you a letter saying more than one return was filed in your name, or that IRS records show you have wages from an employer you don't know.

Learn to protect yourself from tax identity theft and IRS imposter scams, and what to do if someone you know becomes a victim. The FTC and partners including the IRS, the Department of Veterans Affairs, and the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration will be co-hosting free webinars and Twitter chats during Tax Identity Theft Awareness Week.

#### WHAT TO DO IF YOUR CHILD GOES MISSING

#### Prevention is the Key!

No one wants to think about their child going missing. We bury these terrifying thoughts. But knowing how to react could save your child's life.

#### THE FIRST 24 HOURS

- 1. Immediately call 9-1-1 to report your child missing to your local law enforcement.
- 2. Limit access to your home until police arrive and have collected possible evidence. Do not touch or remove anything from your child's room.
- 3. Ask for the name and phone number of the investigator assigned to your case.
- 4. Give investigator all the facts & circumstances relating to your child's disappearance, including what efforts have already been made to search for your child.
- 5. Note if your child had a change in eating habits, mood swings, new friends.
- 6. Make a list of friends and phone numbers. Turn over your child's computer, diary or cell phone.
- 7. Write a detailed description of the clothes the child was wearing. Check to see what is not in the room/closet.
- 8. Have a recent photo and description of child: hair, eyes, height, weight, skin color, scars/tattoos.
- 9. Ask the police to organize a search and include track dogs.
- 10. Ask friends to help, they know the child.
- 11. Ask police to use A Child Is Missing, the media and Amber Alert (if the situation qualifies).
- 12. Designate one person to answer your phone. Take notes with time and date.
- 13. Keep a notebook with you to jot down messages. Include date/time; Be strong, even force yourself to eat.

#### THE SECOND 24 HOURS

- 1. Follow up on all the things you did the first day.
- 2. Report all extortion attempts to law enforcement (if applicable).
- 3. Keep your cell phone near you at all times.
- 4. Make a list of what volunteers can do for you.

**PREVENTION IS KEY!** The best thing is to teach children not to go near strangers, in cars, and do not fall for stories such as 'come see my little puppy' or 'your mommy sent me to get you' or 'I need help'. Have a codeword for people to use when picking up your child. Remind kids to always be aware of where they are.

### WORKING OUTDOORS? CALL 811 BEFORE YOU DIG

Sunshine 811 is a Free Public Service that Assists the Public with Locating Underground Utilities.



What Do the Colors Mean? See survey markings in your neighborhood? Here's what the marks mean:



After utilities are marked on your property, dig carefully around the area that is marked. It is recommended to avoid the "tolerance zone" which is 2' on either side of the marking.



Installing a fence or mailbox? Anchoring play equipment? If you are doing work in your yard that requires you to dig into the earth, be sure to call 811 to dig safely on your property. The service is free for the public and it's not just for contractors!

Safe digging is everyone's responsibility. Deciding to take a shortcut during weekend projects can lead to Internet and cable outages, injuries and sometimes worse. That's why it's so important – and it's the law – to have buried utilities in your yard located and marked before you dig.

#### **How Do I Make My Request?**

If you are planning to dig on your property, make a service request by:

- Calling 811 to make the request by phone
- Click here to open an online ticket

It usually takes up to 48 hours for all utilities located within your designated work area to respond to your property and make their marks. After the marks are done, you can safely work around the marked area with peace of mind that your work will not interfere with underground utilities.




