WESTON'S BULK TRASH PICKUP SCHEDULE

January 2018

Out with the old, in with the new! Clean out your garage, closets, and storage sheds in time for this month's **FREE** Bulk Pickup, which occurs quarterly throughout the year. Pickup takes place on your *regularly scheduled garbage collection day*.

January 2018:

Single Family Homes and Multi-Family Units with curbside collection

On the day of your regularly scheduled garbage collection: Wednesday, Jan. 17th; Thursday, Jan. 18th or Friday, Jan. 19th

Multi-family units with dumpsters Saturday, Jan. 20th

Bulk items include but are not limited to:

- Furniture, mattresses, carpets and other large household items.
- Large and small appliances, such as dishwashers, laundry machines and stoves.
- Refrigerators or air conditioners must have Freon removed by a certified dealer.
- Mirrors, glass, glass top tables, windowpanes, and plate glass items should be safely placed in a rigid container.



NOT COLLECTED: Bulk items DO NOT include contractor-generated material, or vegetative waste (landscape materials) or household hazardous waste.



THINK BEFORE YOU TRASH – CONSIDER DONATING ITEMS:

Help those in need, keep items out of the waste stream, **and** get a tax deduction. Several national organizations will even pick up directly from your residence.






FLOOD INSURANCE RESOLVE TO BUY FLOOD INSURANCE IN THE NEW YEAR

Floods are the #1 natural disaster in the United States.

National Flood Insurance Program – Summary of Coverage

FEMA urges you to buy flood insurance before a flood event. In simple terms, a flood is an excess of water on land that is normally dry.

The City of Weston participates in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) which means Weston property owners are eligible to purchase flood insurance through FEMA from an insurance agent. The City's participation in the Community Rating System, provides property owners up to a 15 percent discount on the cost of a NFIP flood policy.

Anywhere it rains, it can flood.

You don't have to live in south Florida
long to know it rains here a lot.

In Weston, most residences are located in what is called Zone 'X' which is a lower risk flood zone and you are not required to carry flood insurance, yet almost 25 percent of flood-insurance claims come from low-to-moderate risk areas.

A flood-insurance policy protects you financially even when a presidential disaster is not declared or if you live in a county that was not designated for federal assistance. Most homeowner insurance DOES NOT cover flood damage. Just a few inches of water can cause thousands of dollars in damage.

As of Dec. 26, 2017, more than 27,690 NFIP claims for damage caused by Hurricane Irma had been filed, with 80.63 percent closed. More than \$609 million had been paid to policyholders.



BROWARD COUNTY INTRODUCES

I Spy a Manatee App



The 'I Spy a Manatee' mobile app is used by Broward County residents and visitors to report manatee sightings to the County's Environmental Planning and Community Resilience Division and is available for Android and Apple. Use the app to report manatees and their activities, and view manatee protection and boating safety zones in Broward County.

In the app, you can take a picture of the manatee or select a picture from the device's gallery. Enter the sighting information such as number of manatees and the manatees' activity, and either enter the location or let the device use the location services to find the location for you.

Also with the app, you can view a map of the County's waterways with State-regulated Manatee Protection and Boating Safety zones. With location services active, the map will also display the mobile device's location on the waterway.

Even without location services active, the map can still display a nearby location if the user provides a valid address. A legend can be accessed to provide an overall list of the Manatee Protection and Boating Safety Zones.



The Quarterly Residential Bulk Trash Pickup will occur in January on your regularly scheduled garbage collection day as follows.

Single Family & Multi-family with curbside collection:

Wednesday, January 17, Thursday, January 18 OR Friday, January 19

Multi-Family with dumpsters ("Containerized Service"): Saturday, January 20th

FREE Bulk Pickup will take place on your regularly scheduled garbage collection day and all items should be curbside by 7 a.m. Bulk Waste service is not to exceed 6 cubic yards of waste per residential household unit.

Bulk items include but are not limited to:

- Furniture, mattresses, carpets and other large household items.
- Large and small appliances, such as dishwashers, laundry machines and stoves.
- Refrigerators or air conditioners must have Freon removed by a certified dealer.
- Mirrors, glass, glass top tables, windowpanes, and plate glass items should be safely placed in a rigid container to facilitate safe collection.
- Customer-generated vegetative debris (tree branches must be 6" in diameter or less).


