# FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE EFFORT TO ERADICATE EXOTIC FRUIT FLY





The Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services has positively identified the presence of three Oriental fruit flies, Bactrocera dorsalis, in South Florida. The initial fly was discovered during routine trapping, and additional flies were discovered during expanded trapping activities.

The department, along with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, monitors more than 56,000 fruit fly traps statewide, including in Weston, as an early detection network against exotic fruit fly introductions that threaten Florida's agriculture industry.

To eradicate this pest, treatment is being conducted in a 1.5-square-mile area around the fly detections. This treatment consists of attracting male flies to bait which consists of an attractant, an insecticide, and a thickening agent. The flies are killed when they feed on the bait.

The mixture is applied every other week to the upper portion of utility poles, trees and inanimate objects for a period of two life cycles of the fly. Approximately 30 days after the treatment is complete, and no additional fly has been detected, is also required to declare eradication.

Bicycling can be a really good way for people to get a great workout and spend a fun time with friends and family. It helps them get in shape, lower risks of health conditions such as heart disease, and save money on gas. However, knowing how to be safe on the road is no less important for cyclists than it is for car drivers.

#### Here are some safety tips to keep in mind when riding your bike:

- \*\* Ride a bike that's the right size: Riders of any age should be able to put one leg on each side of the top bar of their bike with both feet flat on the ground. Otherwise, the bike isn't safe to ride.
- \*\* Check the brakes: Re-check the brakes before you ride. If you are choosing a bike for a child, choose one that brakes when the rider pedals backwards. Young children's hands are not big or strong enough to use hand brakes.
- Wear a helmet: Wear a helmet every time and everywhere you ride a bike. Make sure the helmet is flat on the top of your head, covering your forehead, as well as fitted and buckled snugly under your chin.
- **Be Easy to See:** Wear neon, fluorescent, or other bright colors, or put something on your clothes or bike that reflects light, like reflective tape. If you are riding at night, make sure your bike has reflections on the front, back and wheels, as well as battery-powered lights on the front and back of the bike.
- Learn Hand Signals: For a left turn, look behind you, hold your left arm straight out to the side, and turn carefully. For a right turn, hold your left arm out and up in an "L" shape. To signal that you are stopping, hold your left arm out and down in an upside down "L" shape.

# LIGHTNING SAFETY FOR YOU AND YOUR FAMILY



Lightning strikes are deadly, killing an average of 47 people in the United States annually. There are a few basic safety tips to keep in mind that will protect you and your family from harm during a thunderstorm.

#### When the Thunder Roars, Go Indoors

If you are caught outside during a thunderstorm, run to a building or hard topped vehicle. You are NOT safe outdoors. Crouching down or seeking shelter under a tree does not reduce your risk of being struck. In fact, being under a tree is the second leading cause of lightning casualties.

## No Clouds Overhead? Be Aware of Approaching Storms

Lightning can strike 10-15 miles ahead of a thunderstorm. It is common for lightning to strike in seemingly 'perfect' weather - sunny skies and minimal clouds – so be aware of oncoming storms.

#### **Are You Grounded?**

The thought that you are safe in a vehicle because you are 'grounded' by the rubber tires is false. Most cars are safe from lightning because the metal roof and sides allow the electricity to travel through the metal frame of the vehicle into the ground. Do not lean on doors or metal parts during a storm.

#### What Attracts Lightning?

Height, pointy shape and isolation are dominant factors controlling where a lightning bolt will strike; however, the myth that metal objects attracts lightning is false. Metal conducts electricity, but does not attract a strike. Stay away from metal fences, gutters, bleachers, tent structures, etc. Seek appropriate shelter.

### MOVIES AND TV SHOWS ON THE GO GoChip Now Available at BCL

The Go Chip, a portable device that lets you stream movies and hit TV shows without using your data, is now available at 15 Broward County Library locations, including the Weston Branch.

The GoChip lets you take a full season of premiere TV shows such as Outlander or Breaking Bad with you wherever you go, making mobile entertainment surprisingly simple. You will not need to worry about slow internet connections, re-buffering or error messages. You and your family and friends can also watch different episodes on eight different devices simultaneously.

You can check out a GoChip just as you would any other library material. It can be checked out for seven days each time, and you can renew twice, for two days at a time, for a total of 11 days.

All you need to check out a GoChip is your Broward County Library card.


