many months of litigation, and hundreds of thousands of dollars in legal fees on both sides, we settled the lawsuit. Although there were numerous claims on both sides, our ultimate goal was to have cable voluntary for all residents, and ultimately terminate the agreement. Under the original agreement, there was no finite termination date, and the agreement was to go on forever, with no caps on rates. With this settlement, the agreement terminates on December 31, 2013, and caps rates and rate increases. Although this might seem like a long time away, the Commission felt that this was the best settlement, with the least amount of downside risk to the residents. So, for those who would rather have another form of television subscription, such as a dish, the mandatory fees will eventually disappear, and all service will be voluntary. The settlement of this lawsuit concludes the years of transition we have been through as Arvida completed the development and left Weston.

On a real positive note, for the 10th year in a row, and since our inception as a city, there will be NO INCREASE in your ad-valorum tax rate, and we will once again have the LOW-EST ad-valorum tax rate of any city in Broward County. We have been able to continually increase city services over the years, but keep the same tax rate as a result of multi-year planning, prudent budgeting, and having a contract style of managing our government.

Did you know that for a house assessed at \$300,000, although your total taxes might be around \$6,000, the amount you pay the City of Weston for ad-valorum taxes is only about \$457, amounting to less than 8% of the tax bill? Most of your taxes go to other governmental agencies such as Broward County, the Hospital District, and the Broward School District, among others. There are many components to your tax bill, and I would encourage you to look carefully at your trim notice to see who's charging what. Most importantly, don't forget to apply for the \$25,000 Florida Homestead Exemption if you buy a new home, or move to a new one. The Save Our Homes initiative will cap the increase in your assessed property value to 3% per year.

Finally, I want to wish all of us a Happy Birthday, as the City of Weston is now 10 years old! We've come a long way in a relative short period of time, and we are very proud of our accomplishments. When I think back to my first election to the Indian Trace Board of Supervisors back in 1993, and to the first commission in 1996, it's hard to believe that our plans, visions, and dreams have really come to reality.

I invite each of you to visit our web site, at www.westonfl. org, and view the 10th anniversary video. For many who are not familiar with our history, it will provide some great insight, and it's a lot of fun to look back and feel proud of our city.

We look forward to many great years to come, as we are constantly striving to make Weston the best place to live and work in Florida.



Cypress Bay High School, or as Principal Scott Neely calls it, the University of Cypress Bay, opened its doors for the fourth year this August. This year over 5,400 students will attend "the Bay", most of them residing in Weston. That's nearly twice as many students as the school was originally designed for!

To address this critically overcrowded situation, the School Board has funded in its five-year facilities plan the construction of a new high school to relieve the overcrowding at Cypress Bay. The Board has designated this school as "MMM".

The School Board has called on the City to identify a 45 acre site within the City upon which to construct the new school, with a preference towards the northern portion of the City as that is where a large percentage of the students reside. The Board is also looking at sites outside of the City as well.

Siting a new school anywhere in Broward County is both difficult and costly due to the price of and lack of availability of vacant land. This is especially true in Weston since we are a planned community and have achieved build-out. To meet this pressing need of the School Board and the families of Weston, a creative and unconventional approach is required.



The City has identified a site along the west side of South Post Road, between the Regional Park and the City's new Public Works/Disaster Management Services Center. The vacant site presently belongs to the South Florida Water Management District and is degraded pasture land. For the school to be constructed on this site, several transactions would have to occur. The City's Indian Trace Development District owns 1,882 acres of land adjacent to the Water Management District's 1,490 acres of land. The Indian Trace District would acquire from the Water Management District the proposed high school site in exchange for giving the Water Management District a similar amount of Indian Trace District land. The Indian Trace District would then give this newly acquired land to the School Board at no cost, with the Board being responsible to construct the school and any environmental impacts. These transactions and construction would be subject to approvals from the Broward County Environmental Department, the South Florida Water Management District, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

The benefits are greater than the construction of a needed school right where it belongs. With land prices in the high six-figures per acre, the cost savings to the School Board of not having to use valuable taxpayer dollars to pay for the land will enable the Board to relieve overcrowding elsewhere and sooner. The development of the site will require the construction of even more wetland mitigation acres, adding to Weston's already abundant and thriving preserve areas. The site of the school will be on the edge of a wetland preserve that will enable the school to offer students and the community an environmental education opportunity like no other. The proximity of the school to the student population will minimize the need for bussing, and the attendant traffic, air quality, and fuel cost issues. The alternative is the School Board paying millions of taxpayer dollars for land outside of the City, where the new school would then be constructed.

The City of Weston has enjoyed a rich history of placing a high value on education and working with the School Board to acquire its needed facilities. It was the City that got Weston's developer to dedicate the land for Everglades Elementary and Gator Run Elementary, two schools that were not provided for in Weston's Master Plan. It was the City that insisted that another developer provide land for Manatee Isles Elementary School. The School Board was always right there to immediately construct the much needed schools. The City obtained the funding and oversaw the construction of the football field lighting and bleachers, and the baseball field lighting at Cypress Bay. We must continue this tradition, and we're ready to do it once again.

Is this approach creative and unconventional; it certainly is. Does it have its challenges; absolutely. Can it be done; YES, if ALL of the parties involved want to make it happen, it will. This is an opportunity to respond responsibly to a genuine need that will yield much more that the desired results. The City is committed to work with the School Board, and all of the governmental entities having jurisdiction, to produce an outstanding educational institution and to enhance the environment.

On a different note, please join me in wishing a happy retirement to Broward Sheriff's Office Sergeant Jerry Ross. Jerry is the longest serving law enforcement officer in Weston, arriving long before Weston was Weston, and he leaves us after 27 years with the Sheriff's Office. Jerry's personality and the manner in which he conducted his law enforcement activities exemplified the best of Weston. Weston will miss Jerry, and I'll miss a good friend.



2007 Homestead Application Pre-Filings Taken at Weston Community Center

All Florida residents are eligible for a Homestead Exemption on their residence, which provides a tax-saving exemption on the first \$25,000 of the assessed value of an owner-occupied residence, and caps taxable value annual increases at not greater than 3%.



Holiday Run Scheduled for December 10th

Route Changed to Minimize Traffic Delays

The Rotary Club of Weston will host the 9th Annual Remax Hometown Rotary Holiday Run featuring a 5K Run and Half Marathon on Sunday, December 10, 2006. The proceeds from this annual event benefit numerous local charities including the Rotary Foundation, Weston Rotary Charities, the Baudhuin Autistic Preschool, the YMCA, Multiple Sclerosis and the Miami Project to Cure Paralysis.

The routes for both races have been changed this year in order to minimize any inconvenience for local residents, but some temporary street closings and minor delays will occur.

Both races start and finish on Vista Park Blvd. near the entrance to Vista Park.

- The Half Marathon will begin at 7:00 am and goes east on Vista Park Blvd. to Bonaventure Blvd., north on Bonaventure Blvd. to Royal Palm Blvd., west on Royal Palm Blvd./Glades Parkway to a turnaround at Park Road, east on Glades Parkway/Royal Palm Blvd. to Bonaventure Blvd., south on Bonaventure Blvd. to Vista Park Blvd. and west on Vista Park Blvd. to the finish line.
- The 5K run begins at approximately 7:20 am and goes east on Vista Park Blvd., north on Bonaventure Blvd. to a turnaround at Everglades Elementary School, south on Bonaventure Blvd. to Vista Park Blvd. and west on Vista Park Blvd. to the finish line.

Road Closures - December 10th

- The west bound lanes of Vista Park Blvd. from Bonaventure Blvd. to the finish lane will be closed to traffic from 6:00 am 10:00 am.
- The east bound lanes of Vista Park Blvd. from

Bonaventure Blvd. to the finish line will be designated for two-way traffic from 6:00 am - 10:00 am.

- Both the north bound and south bound lanes of Bonaventure Blvd. from South Post Road to Royal Palm Blvd. will be closed to traffic from 6:00 am - 10:00 am
- West Bound Royal Palm Blvd., from Bonaventure Blvd. to Town Center Blvd., will be closed from 7a.m. 8:30 a.m..

Runners will occupy one lane on the remainder of the race courses with one lane reserved for vehicular traffic. Orange safety cones and signs will designate the lane to be used by runners and vehicles. Delays can be expected on Bonaventure Blvd. from Vista Park Blvd. to South Post Road and on Royal Palm Blvd./Glades Parkway from Bonaventure Blvd. to Park Road. The Broward Sheriff's Office will have deputies stationed at all intersections to assist with traffic flow, but anyone traveling in this area between 6:00 am and 10:00 am should allow for additional time to reach their destination.


FIRE & ICE ... ARENA Skates toward reality

Eight years in the making, an ice and sports arena in Weston comes closer to reality. The proposed facility would include two, National Hockey League regulation-size ice rinks, three, regulation-size basketball courts, party rooms, a food venue and a pro shop. The basketball space is being designed with the ability to convert space for multipurpose uses such as volleyball and gymnastic competitions.

On May 15th the City Commission approved an agreement for the design, construction, management and operation of an ice & sports arena at Weston's Vista Park. Vista Park, located at 18800 Vista Park Boulevard, has 5 acres vacant at the park's north end where the facility would be constructed.

The agreement provides the City Commission three opportunities within the Preconstruction phase to vote to move forward or terminate the agreement. These decisions will be made at the 50% design completion stage, the 80% completion stage and again at 100%, based upon the financial viability of the project. The Preconstruction phase, now in progress, is expected to take six months. IF the project is given final approval, construction is anticipated to take one year from the initiation of construction.

If constructed, the Weston facility will offer programs for every age, including figure skating programs, adult & youth ice hockey leagues and lessons, Learn to Skate program (3-8 years of age), Coffee Club – Adult Learn to Skate, camp programs and, of course, public skating for all ages. The basketball courts will offer opportunities for league and open play, as well as special events and the party rooms will be available for all types of celebrations. The hours of operation will be 5am-1am Monday to Sunday and once open the NHL Panthers team would move their practices primarily to the Weston rink.



The Parks Report

With 12 municipal parks and the Weston Tennis Center, the Community Services Department is constantly assessing the equipment and fields at every facility. Maintenance, improvements and upgrades are provided to preserve and enhance the superb quality of our Weston parks system. Recent and upcoming improvements include:

Weston Regional Park – All new lighting has been installed on the athletic fields. Shade cover repairs should be completed by the end of August.

The City is pleased to announce Weston's recent Broward Beautiful GreenSHADE grant award of \$9,057.40 for tree planting within the Weston Regional Park.

Tequesta Trace Park – All new lighting has been installed on the athletic fields. Repairs to the fencing and bleachers have also been completed. Shade cover repairs should be finished by the end of August. Plans are being designed for upgrades that will include new entry gates and landscape improvements.

Vista Park – Repairs to shade covers are ongoing and should be completed by the end of August.

Other Parks – Repairs to the shade covers at Country Isles, Emerald Estates, Gator Run, Heron, Indian Trace and Windmill Ranch parks should be completed by the end of August.

Library Park – The City is in the final design phase on plans for Library Park, which will bring the total number of Weston's municipal parks to 13. This 5-acre passive park will be located at the corner of Vista Park and Bonaventure Boulevards, adjacent to the new Broward County Weston Branch Library. Incorporated into its design are walkways, shelters, a fountain and informational signage about Florida authors. View the rendering above.

On August 21st Senator Nan Rich along with State Representatives Franklin Sands and Susan Goldstein will present a \$200,000 Florida Recreation Development Assistance





Program (FRDAP) grant check to the City Commission which has been awarded by the State for Library Park.

Weston is working in coordination with the School Board of Broward County on two projects:

Windmill Ranch Park - A new parking area is being constructed by the School Board, adjacent to the playground and should be completed by August. Additional parking will be constructed for this 5-acre park located adjacent to Everglades Elementary School.

Cypress Bay High School Football Stadium – The City is assisting in the funding and construction of additional bleachers for the expansion of the high school stadium seating which will be completed by the end of August.

The more calls registered from an area (such as Weston), the more land or aerial spraying the county will do in that area. Inspectors will be notified and will seek out the cause of the problem.

City Employees Become Certified in Emergency Management

Among the many preparations the City is implementing for hurricane season is emergency management training for City employees. The City, also, is updating its emergency management plan pursuant to federal standards. All key contractual staffers, about 200 people, must pass National Incident Management System course testing, identified by the federal government as the preferred system.

FEMA has already implemented more stringent controls and safeguards which are in place for the 2006 hurricane season. The emergency management training of Weston staff will make the management of incidents more efficient, will provide uniform communication when working with other cities and agencies before and after an emergency, and will ensure that our City is eligible for FEMA reimbursements after a disaster declaration.

A reminder to residents on emergency preparation: The amount of time individuals have to prepare for a hurricane can be up to a few days. However, many disasters allow no time for people to gather even the most basic necessities, which is why planning ahead and having a plan in place, are essential.

TRACKYOUR BUILDING PERMIT ON-LINE

With the increase in building permits being issued for repairs due to the hurricane, we want to remind residents that they can track the life-cycle of their permits on-line. What this means is that you can see all approvals or denials from the building review disciplines (if applicable), when inspections are requested by your contractor, when they are completed, any deficiencies noted or additional requirements of your contractor, and when the final inspection is complete.

How To Track Your Permit

Once your contractor has been issued a permit for the job, go to www.westonfl.org.

- 1) Click on Weston Government, and then Building Code Services.
- 2) You will see: **Click here to:** Check on a Permit. Click it.
- Now click on the ICON labeled Sign up as a Resident
- 4) Put in your address. You will then be prompted to create a User Name & Password, and fill out some contact information.

That's It. With your User Name and Password you can track your permit any time, from any computer.



Weston Residents Get a Grip

TYREGRIP SURFACE INSTALLED ON RAMP

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) authorized the installation of a high-friction roadway surface, Tyregrip, to a 300-foot section of the northbound I-75 ramp at Royal Palm Boulevard. The product is resistant to oil and petrol and has shown long lasting durability and skid resistance properties under both wet and dry pavement conditions. FDOT will evaluate the effectiveness of the Tyregrip surface over a three-year period, hoping it will provide an enhanced safety feature to the roadway. The Weston location is the first time Tyregrip is being tested in Florida, and FDOT will be performing skid tests on the surface under wet conditions. If successful, it will then be used in other locations. Residents can recognize the surface on the ramp as they approach I-75, the 300-foot section is textured and darker tan in color.



City Prepares for Hurricane Season with Generators to Power Traffic Signals During Power Outages

With hurricane season here and the prediction of another active storm season, the City is now prepared to power traffic intersections with generators for each major signalized intersection, in the event of a power outage. The generators will provide for an immediate response and eliminate a potentially hazardous situation.

After last seasons power outages the City Commission determined that the purchase of the generators for each

intersection would best serve residents and mitigate the dangerous traffic situations caused by inoperable traffic signals.

Weston has also changed the signal heads at all intersections to the horizontal position (versus former vertical hanging alignment), providing for greater stability during a storm. The signal heads being in the horizontal position will have less surface area for wind to catch.

City Officials Break Ground For Weston's New City Hall


Weston City Officials began the celebration of the community's 10 year anniversary and the annual 4th of July activities with a ground breaking ceremony for City Hall. With shovels in hand, the Weston Commission made the first break in the earth on the morning of Tuesday, July 4th. The City currently leases office space. The

building of City Hall will provide much needed additional space and serve the needs of the City for many years.

The City Hall will be located at 17200 Royal Palm Blvd., adjacent to the Police Services Station and Fire Station #81 on 3.5 acres. It will be a 14,000 square-foot, one-story building, which includes a City Commission Chamber. Currently, the Commission meetings are held at the Community Center.

The building will include a fully integrated standby power system to enable the City to maintain services during and after any power outage. City Hall will feature a state-of-the-art Commission Chamber with seating for 156 guests, and will house the departments of the City Manager, Assistant City Manager, City Clerk and Communications. There will be conference rooms for the City Commission and staff, along with much needed expanded office and storage areas. The lobby area will provide residents and visitors with City information in a comfortable setting. Construction is expected to take 12 months.

Weston's Bonaventure Development District Receives One-Million Dollars

The South Florida Water Management District presented the City of Weston with a check for one-million dollars at the June 19 Commission meeting to help fund repairs and improvements to the storm water management system serving Bonaventure.

The Bonaventure community was developed in the early 1970's and annexed into the City of Weston in 1997. The community encompasses 1,325 acres, has a full-time resident population in excess of 12,000, a major hotel/conference facility, as well as commercial properties.

Bonaventure's storm water management system consists

of more than 160 acres of interconnected lakes and canals discharging into the South Florida Water Management District' (SFWMD) North New River Canal. The water quality and discharge rates are controlled by two storm water pump stations on the northern boundary of the community.

After an extensive evaluation of the water management system serving Bonaventure, the pumps and engines, although functional, are from the original construction, have been exposed to the weather, and would most likely not survive a significant storm event when they are most needed. Repairs and improvements are expected to be completed in the Fall of 2008.

More Seats for Cypress Bay Stadium

Cypress Bay High School students will receive 724 more seats added to their stadium bleachers which currently seat 2500. Funded by the City of Weston and the School Board of Broward County, the addition of the seats will provide room for more spectators to enjoy the football and soccer games, and the special events that take place on the field.

The current stands have been filled to capacity since they were completed by the City in September of 2004.

The seating is being installed with the goal of being completed by September . . . just in time for kickoff at the first football game of the new school year.


