This change was precipitated by two core factors: Economics and Technology.

■ Economics - the cost of designing, printing and mailing over 23,000 copies of the Announcer, four times a year, is approximately \$100,000 annually. In a tight economy where alternatives are available, the choice for change was chosen.

with some information going out even further.



The 2010 season is upon us and it is time to get ready for an exciting year on the courts. Many players at this stage take the time to work on a few small things in their game and most players begin working on a different grip or stroke. A couple tips to help with that transition.

- 1. Most of the time when you change something it's not going to work in the short term. This is because it is not comfortable and the body will resist. Be patient with the grip or swing and remember that you always have the old swing in the bag, so be fearless.
- 2. Grip pressure on a new swing or specifically a grip change: When you make that change you tend to squeeze the racquet and the tension will cause fatigues and most likely injuries. Try not to try so hard and keep that grip pressure at least a 2 out of 5.
- 3. Start small and slow and then build up the confidence. If you are working specifically with a new swing to help with topspin, make sure you feel what the stroke is doing to the ball. There is no feel when you are muscling that ball, keep it smooth and work the technique and you'll find results quicker.

I hope these tips help with those small transitions and you continue your journey on being a better player and reaching your goals.

Do You Count? – Ensure that you do.
The 2010 U.S. Census needs to count
every single person living in Weston
as of April 1, 2010 - renters; caretakers;
children; parents, relatives and friends
residing in your home; illegal aliens;

college students; and those that live outside of the US during other periods of the year. *Simply,* everyone. Ensure you are counted so that you, your city, your county and state get the share of federal dollars deserved.

### Don't Want to Wait?

The safest way to dispose of hazardous home chemicals is to carefully pack them up and bring them to one of Broward County's HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW) Collection Centers. The HHW program accepts hazardous chemicals generated from Broward County residents **FREE OF CHARGE** and disposes or recycles them according to all local, state and federal regulations. Each Saturday between the hours or 8 a.m. and 3 p.m. HHW drop-off centers are open to collect waste that cannot be collected curbside.

## What is Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)?

HHW refers to used or leftover contents of consumer products that contain chemicals with one of the four characteristics: *Toxic, Ignitable, Corrosive, or Reactive* as defined by the Environmental Protection Agency.

<u>Household Hazardous Waste includes</u>: oil and latex paints and thinners, used motor oil, auto fluids and gasoline solvents, pesticides, fertilizers, pool chemicals, drain cleaners, tires, mercury, rechargeable & automobile batteries and electronics.











## Fire Safety

camera to ensure there are no hot spots remaining in the home.

Cooking fires are the most common cause of home fires in the U.S. BSO Fire Rescue reminds resident to check stove burners and candles (another common cause for fires) before leaving the home or going to bed.



## TO DEFINE WHO WE ARE AS A NATION

## The Census: A Snapshot

- What: The census is a count of everyone residing in the United States.
- Who: All U.S. residents must be counted—both citizens and non citizens.
- When: You will receive your questionnaire in March 2010 either by U.S. mail or hand delivery. Some people in remote areas will be counted in person.
- Why: The U.S. Constitution requires a national census once every 10 years to count the population and determine the number of seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives.
- How: Households should complete and mail back their questionnaires upon receipt. Households that do not respond may receive a replacement questionnaire in early April. Census takers will visit households that do not return questionnaires to take a count in person.

## A Complete Count: The Importance of Census Data

- Every year, the federal government allocates more than \$400 billion to states and communities based, in part, on census data.
- Census data are used to determine locations for retail stores, schools, hospitals, new housing developments and other community facilities.
- Census data determine boundaries for state and local legislative and congressional districts.

## 2010 Census Questionnaire: Easy, Important and Safe

- With only 10 questions, the 2010 Census questionnaire takes approximately 10 minutes to complete. Households are asked to provide key demographic information, including: whether a housing unit is rented or owned; the address of the residence; and the names, genders, ages and races of others living in the household.
- By law, the Census Bureau cannot share an individual's responses with anyone, including other federal agencies and law enforcement entities.

### **CENSUS HISTORY**

The first census took place in 1790 to determine the number of seats each state would have in the U.S. House of Representatives. The census also was created to gain a better understanding of where people lived and to establish patterns of settlement as the nation grew.

## Frequently Asked Questions

### 1. Q. Who should fill out the census questionnaire?

A. The individual in whose name the housing unit is owned or rented should complete the questionnaire on behalf of every person living in the residence, including relatives and non-relatives.

### 2. Q. How will the 2010 Census differ from previous censuses?

A. In 2010, every residence will receive a short questionnaire of just 10 questions. More detailed socioeconomic information previously collected through the decennial census will be asked of a small percentage of the population through the annual American Community Survey. To learn more about the American Community Survey, visit www.census.gov.

### 3. Q. How are census data used?

A. Census data determine the number of seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives. Census data also can help determine the allocation of federal funds for community services, such as school lunch programs and senior citizen centers, and new construction, such as highways and hospitals.

## 4. Q. What kind of assistance is available to help people complete the questionnaire?

A. 2010 Census questionnaire language assistance guides are available in a variety of languages. Questionnaire Assistance Centers (QAC) will also assist those unable to read or understand the questionnaire. Large-print questionnaires are available to the visually impaired upon request, and a Teletext Device for the Deaf (TDD) program will help the hearing impaired. Contact your Regional Census Center for more details about the types of assistance available and for QAC locations.

## 5. Q. How does the Census Bureau count people without a permanent residence?

A. Census Bureau workers undertake extensive operations to take in-person counts of people living in group quarters, such as college dormitories, military barracks, nursing homes and shelters, as well as those who have been displaced by natural disasters.

# National Flood Insurance Program Grants 10% Discount to Weston Residents!

As of May 1, 2009 the City of Weston was accepted as a participant in the National Flood Insurance Program Community Rating System, with a Class 8 rating.

### FLOOD WARNINGS

The City of Weston in coordination with Broward County, has a warning system to notify residents of impending flood danger. Warnings will be transmitted on television, radio, telephones and other media. Listen for instructions during times of flood risk.

### **FLOOD SAFETY**

Even if your area is not known for flooding or not directly hit by heavy winds, flooding is a potential threat.

Knowing what to do to minimize losses is paramount. These are precautionary steps:

- Turn off electricity and natural gas.
- Have a battery-powered radio or television to monitor storm and flood

warning information.

- Heed warning and evacuation instructions from disaster officials.
   Weston is not in an evacuation zone but residents may need to go to a shelter, or evacuate in a disaster.
- Take your own essentials (food, toiletries, clothes, etc.) Be careful to distinguish between roads and canals during severe flooding.

### PROPERTY PROTECTION

There are numerous ways to minimize property losses from flood damage, including:

- Move furniture and other household valuables to rooms or spaces in the upper story of the dwelling or a location higher than the regular floor elevation
- Park your car on high ground, preferably inside a garage or shelter.
- Cut down loose tree limbs and palm fronds. Check around outside of home, securing anything that could become airborne in a storm.
- Secure windows, putting up storm shutters or boards.

### FLOOD INSURANCE

Most homeowner insurance policies DO NOT cover loss due to flooding. You need a flood insurance policy. Property owners can insure buildings and contents; renters can insure possessions. The City of Weston participates in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP)

All residents and businesses in Weston qualify for National Flood Insurance Program policies. A 10% discount is received due to Weston's participation in the Community Rating System.

to provide city residents with the initial qualification to purchase flood insurance and qualifies properties in Weston for a 10% discount.

## FLOODPLAIN DEVELOPMENT PERMITS

All development, including new construction, repair/replacement work and additions, signs, fences, fill and tree removal requires a permit.

## STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

Stormwater is managed through a system of drainage catch basins, lakes and canals maintained regularly by our Public Works Department. Water flow, especially during heavy storms, is essential to flood prevention. City and state laws prohibit dumping in waterways. ## A Note from the City Manager

## John R. Flint

The more things change, the better they can be. We have many changes in store for the New Year, and all for the better. You're holding in your hand the first noticeable change, our Weston Announcer; this is our last edition. The Announcer served us well during the city's first 12 years, winning numerous national and international awards and recognitions, a testament to our Communications staff. Now it's time to move forward, make the best use of the technology available and deliver our information in the most contemporary way. We're changing

the way we'll be communicating with you: more often, more information, greater ease, less costly, and always on. We've re-branded our Weston media to "Weston Always On" because whether it's our website, our cable channels, or our AM radio, they are all "always on".

Take a few moments to read our cover article about "Weston Always On", the changes to our website, including the new "Newsday Tuesday", its how we'll deliver our news to you.

The next noticeable change is as you drive along Weston's main roadways; you'll see new traffic signs being installed. These signs aren't just any signs; these signs are designed, engineered and tested to withstand significant storm force winds, the first in south Florida. The City's original sign posts and frames were constructed of wood and PVC, which have deteriorated due to exposure to the elements over time, and we lost hundreds of these signs during Hurricane Wilma. The installation began at the east end of Royal Palm Boulevard and will progress westward, and ultimately all

of the City's public

roadways will receive

the new signs. The entire replacement program will take 2 to 3 years to complete.

A change that you may not even notice is the City's street lighting system. Utilizing an American Recovery and Renewal Act (federal stimulus) grant, we'll be changing the incandescent street light fixtures to fixtures using LED lamps. You shouldn't notice any change in the street lighting, but we'll notice a change in the electric bill. The LED conversion will save almost 70% in on-going energy costs!

Another noticeable change will be the two roundabouts that will be constructed on Bonaventure Boulevard, one at Saddle Club Road and the other at Blatt Boulevard. These two roundabouts will replace the multi-lane four-way stops at each location and expedite traffic flow and improve safety for motorists and pedestrians alike. Construction is expected to begin March 2010.

We look forward to these and many other changes in the New Year, all to make Weston even better.

One thing that will not change is our constant commitment to meet your expectations; let us know what you think, we're only a phone call or email away. In the meantime, look for us on the web, listen to us on the radio, watch us on cable TV, as we're "always on".

Two intersections, Bonaventure Boulevard at Saddle Club Road and Bonaventure Boulevard at Blatt Boulevard will receive improvements to increase safety and efficiency. Both currently 4-way stops with 4lane roads but are not approved by Broward County for traffic signals. In lieu of continuing to wait for possible future approvals from the County, the City will construct a roundabout at each location. Construction is anticipated to begin in March 2010. While there will be intermittent lane closures during construction, the intersections will remain open.

What is a "roundabout"? It is a circular intersection at which traffic is slowed down and enters a one-way stream around a central island. Statistically, roundabouts are safer for drivers and pedestrians than both traffic circles and traditional intersections.

### **Enhanced Appearance**

Roundabouts and their central island provide for enhanced landscaping and a softened visual appearance.

The Homeowners Association of Bonaventure donated \$30,186.94 to the Bonaventure Development District on August 17, 2009, which is dedicated to landscaping costs on the Bonaventure roundabout project.

## Weston Parks Update

### Playground Resurfacing

Resurfacing of the playgrounds at Windmill Ranch Park (next to Everglades Elementary School) and Country Isles Park will take place in 2010. Playground closures will be publicized on the City web page and government access channels. The new, poured-in-place rubberized surfacing will provide for a safe, consistent surface that minimizes injuries due to falls while providing for greater accessibility to meet ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) requirements.

**Playground Safety:** Children should have adult supervision while on the City's playgrounds. Please help prevent injury:

- *Shoes should be worn at all times.*
- Don't wear clothes with drawstrings or other loose items that could get caught on play equipment.
- Don't wear bicycle helmets while on the playground.
- Children should use equipment appropriate for their age. Playground equipment in Weston is designed for children 2 to 12 years old.

## **Country Isles Park Improvements**

The City of Weston has applied for a \$200,000 Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program (FRDAP) grant through the Florida Department of Environmental Protection. In addition to the playground surfacing, plans include replacing the aged playground equipment, replacing the wooden gazebo, improvements to the walking path and ADA access improvements to the parking spaces. Park closures will be publicized.



Skate Park – The skate park located at Weston Regional Park is open during regular park hours. Participants skate at their own risk and must wear helmet, elbow pads and knee pads. Children under 17 may skate only after a parent or legal guardian fills out a waiver available on the City website or at the Community Center.

**Regional Park** – Wi-Fi access is now up and running. Once connected to the Wi-Fi, open your internet

browser, read and approve the disclaimer and you are good to go.

Reminder: Group instruction and training in the City's parks is only permissible with prior authorization from the Parks and Recreation Department. Requirements include carrying liability insurance, completion of background checks and signed contracts with the City of Weston. For more information please call 954-389-4321.

# Cycling & Pedestrian Safety

There aren't many places more conducive to exercising than Weston. The City has an extensive network of sidewalks and over 46 miles of marked bike lanes. While bicycling is great fun and great for you, as with any sport or mode of transportation, precautions must be taken to prevent serious and even life threatening injuries.

#### **Facts:**

- A bicycle is legally defined as a vehicle (a non-motorized vehicle).
- Bicyclists have the same rights to the roadway, and must obey the same traffic laws as operators of other vehicles, including: stop signs, red lights, yielding right-of-way when entering roadway and speed limits.
- Bicyclists have the same rights and duties as a pedestrian when riding on sidewalks or in crosswalks, but must yield to pedestrians and give an audible signal before passing.
- Cyclists and passengers under age 16 are required to wear a helmet.
  - Maximum two riders side-by-side.





Cyclists must obey all applicable traffic control devices such as traffic signals, signs and markings. Know and use proper hand signals when turning and be especially cautious when passing through intersections. The Broward Sheriff's Office will enforce traffic laws for cyclists in the same manner that they do for motorized vehicles.



Maximum two riders side-by-side.



Ride with traffic, on the right side. Riding in the bike lane, to the right of traffic, is

recommended for best visibility by vehicles and an ability to steer clear of potential intersection accidents.

**Helmets** - 85% of head injuries, the most common serious injury suffered by bicyclists, are reduced by wearing a helmet.

No Headsets - Headsets, headphones or any listening device is prohibited (except hearing aid)

**Be visible** - Wear bright, reflective clothing. Use lights and reflectors in low-light conditions.



# MANATEE ISLES DRIVE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Construction and Improvements Near Completion

For those who live off of, or drive down Manatee Isles Drive, desired roadway improvements are near completion. The project, which commenced in July 2009, has provided for new curbing and gutters, turn lanes, bike lanes, irrigation and landscaping. With the project's estimated completion date of Spring 2010, the improvements have already added much relief for the motorists, cyclists, runners and pedestrians of Manatee Isles Drive.

While there will be some inconvenience to local residents during the final stages of the construction process, contractors will try to mitigate the impact by not working during peak traffic times.

# Cycling & Pedestrian Safety

**Pedestrians** – understood to include "a person afoot, in a wheelchair, on skates, or on a skateboard"

In a roadway or bike lane - pedestrian should face traffic, as far to the left as possible.

Crossing A pedestrian crossing a roadway at any point other than a (marked or unmarked) intersection crosswalk or a marked mid-block crosswalk shall yield to all vehicles on the roadway.

**Courtesy** Pedestrians should heed the maximum two person side-byside in a bike lane, and move to single file if a bicycle is in the lane, so that they may safely pass.

#### **Drivers**

Yield the appropriate right of way. A

pedestrian is considered to be lawfully within a crosswalk if he started crossing in it when it was legal to do so, and is finishing crossing without undue delay.

A driver facing a green indication may need to wait for a pedestrian to finish crossing in the crosswalk. Drive cautiously. Reduce your speed when approaching cyclists. Every driver of a vehicle shall exercise due care to avoid colliding with any pedestrian or any person propelling a human powered vehicle.

**Be considerate.** Be watchful for cyclists when you are driving, do not blast your horn when close to cyclists, and watch for cyclists when opening your doors.

Pass with care. Pass
when conditions are
safe to do so and
leave at least 3 feet
between your vehicle and

the cyclist. Check over your shoulder after passing the cyclist before moving back to the normal lane position.

**Keep a Safe Distance.** Keep a safe distance from cyclists and pedestrians.

## Weston Fire Department Awarded Grant

In a brief ceremony at Weston Fire Station #81 on September 30, 2009 the Weston Fire Department was awarded a \$21,466 grant from Allianz Life Insurance Company of North America.

The money will go toward the purchase of a GPS system to be installed in each Weston fire truck and rescue vehicle. The system will

work with preemption equipment funded by the City to be installed in city-wide traffic signals.

The system activates a signal before the emergency vehicle arrives at intersections to clear the approach of the emergency vehicle, assisting in a faster response time and increasing intersection safety. The Allianz Heritage program encourages employees to support their neighborhoods by nominating a fire department in their community for grants and by performing volunteer work. Agent Andrew Katlin, a Weston resident, nominated the Fire Department for this grant and was present for the ceremony.

### "Broccoli" the African Spurred Tortoise Saved and Provided a New Home

City Drainage Manager David Dove, recognizing that this was not a native species, contacted the Herpetologist at Metrozoo who advised the genus of the tortoise.

Not native to either North or South America, these tortoises, complete with horned shell and thick heavy scales on the forearms, live on the edge of the Sahara desert. It is likely someone purchased him through an exotic pet shop; cost estimates are in the \$1,000 plus range. Why Broccoli? David advised that this very friendly and hungry fellow ate bunches of hand-fed broccoli as well as apple slices.

# With More and More Wildlife in the Area Residents and Motorists Need to Take Precautions

The good news: More and more wildlife is settling into the nearly 2,000 acres of wetland preserves that Weston maintains along the city's western boundary.

With that good news come safety precautions that residents and motorists need to heed, particularly in the areas along Manatee Isles Drive, SW 26<sup>th</sup> Street, Saddle Club and South Post Roads.


Over the past several months the deer population has become noticeably more apparent with numerous sightings on and along South Post Road and Manatee Isles Drive. During the first week of November a full grown buck was struck and killed by a motorist along the western portion of Manatee Isles Drive. Fortunately there were no injuries to the driver (or passengers) but the vehicle sustained extensive damage.

#### **FACTS:**

- Insurance company data shows the total number of deer-vehicle collisions in the US has increased 14.9 percent from five years ago.
- Collisions are more frequent during the deer migration and mating season in October, November and December.
- The combination of growing deer populations and the displacement of deer habitat are producing increasingly hazardous conditions for motorists and deer.

#### TIPS:

- Always wear your seat belt and observe the speed limits!
- If you see a deer in the roadway, brake but do not swerve. Most fatalities and injuries happen when drivers swerve their vehicle and hit



- Deer are most visible at dusk and at dawn.
- Deer often travel in groups, so if you see one crossing the road, chances are there are more.


