In September, the City Commission approved an agreement which formally aligns the Arts Council with the City to help further develop arts and cultural events. Our long standing relationship with Sheriff Jenne puts us in an enviable position as the Sheriff's largest contract city, now with both police and fire protection. #### **Weston Approves Final Budget**

#### Once Again, No Property Tax Increase -With Increased Services

For the seventh year in a row, Weston will maintain the same ad valorem (property tax) rate of 1.5235 for each \$1,000 of assessed value. The City Commission adopted the 2004 budget of \$97,043,356. The annual fire protection fee increased \$7.45 to \$199.79 which is assessed for each single and multi-family unit within the City.

Along with the City's 2010 Business and Strategic Value Plans, the 2004 Budget sets out the resources to complete our goals and objectives for the upcoming year.

This is a good start for an initial awareness of an issue, or issues, in our City, but in most cases, there is a lot more to it.


Now more than ever it is easier to get

One thing that is totally accurate and thorough is our best wishes to all of our Weston families and businesses for a happy, safe and peaceful holiday season.




#### Services Delivered for Each Tax Dollar in Weston



#### Mitigation Areas Hatch New Life

Continuous Compliance Monitoring Requirements Show Us That New Inhabitants Have Moved to Weston

New life continues to grace Weston's mitigation areas, documented through the required compliance monitoring that the City must provide State and Federal agencies.

Historically, Weston was Everglades marsh dominated by sawgrass. The area had been ditched and drained for pastureland and was quickly infested with exotic, nuisance tree species. The Indian Trace Community Development District (ITCDD) restored over 2,000 acres of wetland as mitigation. The homes and businesses in Weston were allowed to be built on the condition that these mitigation wetlands be constructed and maintained.

Objectives of the mitigation plan are to enhance and restore the historic Everglades marsh and the creation of open water and forested wetland habitats to benefit wetland-dependent wildlife. The sites constructed in Weston include varied wetland habitats such as open water, sawgrass marsh, forested tree islands, aquatic shelves and aquatic refuge.

Monitoring requirements of local, state and federal agencies require quarterly and semi-annual reports for each mitigation site for a period of five years, to assess

its progress, any problem areas and its success. Maintenance of the sites includes eliminating specific plant species while fostering the growth of healthy wetland plants. Panoramic photo stations were established as photographs provide a visual record of vegetative cover and environmental conditions. Wildlife in the mitigation areas, such as those depicted here, are also recorded to document the overall health and vitality of each site.

2002/2003 Annual Budget - Recipient of the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award presented by the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA). This is the highest form of recognition in governmental budgeting, achieved by

the entity publishing a budget document that meets strict program criteria, including that it serves as: a policy document; a financial plan; an operations guide; and a communications device.

Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) - The GFOA has awarded the City of Weston the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for its comprehensive annual financial report for the fiscal year ended 2002. The Certificate of Achievement is the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting. An impartial

panel of judges based its decision for the award on the report that meets the high standards of the program including demonstrating a constructive "spirit of full disclosure" to clearly communicate the financial story and motivate potential users and user groups to read the CAFR.

Engineering Firm of the Year - Calvin, Giordano and Associates, the City's contract agent for Planning, Zoning, Engineering and Landscape Architecture services, has been recognized as the South Florida Business Journal's 2003 Business of the Year in the Engineering Category. The program was designed to honor companies in various industries based on company growth and financial performance, employee improvement and benefits programs, and for their commitment to their local community. Additionally: CGA took third place in the Best Cartographic Design-Atlas or Map Series, which showcased the Weston Sewer Utilities Atlas Book, designed by the firm for the City, entered into the contest at the ESRI GIS Conference this year. This conference is the largest Geographic Information System (GIS) event in the world, with over 11,000 attendees from 90 countries. AND: The City of Weston received a Finalist - Wheels in Motion Award. Weston was one of two cities honored as finalists by

South Florida Commuter Services at the Transportation Leadership Awards.

#### Joining Forces to Serve You Better:

Fire Rescue Department Now a Part of the Broward Sheriff's Office

On October 1, 2003, the Broward County Fire Rescue Department, Weston's provider for fire rescue services, joined forces with the Broward Sheriff's Office to unify law enforcement and fire rescue under one umbrella organization. Weston residents will see no immediate physical differences in service, but residents and the organization itself will benefit immediately from:

- Improved emergency communications
- Improved service delivery and efficiency, and elimination of duplicative functions
- Better prepared for critical incidents
- Coordinated hurricane and other disaster responses
- Increased services in neighborhoods

While law enforcement and fire services are clearly two separate professions, and they will remain so, they are often interdependent upon each other for success and ultimately perform the same function: the protection of life and property.

September 11, 2001 showed the nation that a lack of command, control and coordination can cost lives, and this unification of departments and services is a unique step to better serve the residents of Broward County.

The Weston City Commission agreed with Sheriff Jenne's sentiment that the move was a good idea whose time had come, providing the taxpayer with better service at a lower cost and with greater accountability, by approving a resolution supporting the unity. Today, your fire services professionals are members of the Broward Sheriff's Office Department of Fire Rescue & Emergency Services.

#### Vista Park

Construction Is Underway

Construction has begun on the City's last major park. Vista Park, located on 30 acres west of Cypress Bay High School, at 18800 Vista Park Boulevard, is a \$6 million project that will provide residents and leagues with 4 soccer/football fields and 4 baseball/softball fields. The park will also have a playground, two concession/restroom buildings and parking for 500 vehicles. These fields, lighted for night-time play, will provide welcome relief to Weston's ever increasing demand for sports.

A unique feature included in the design of Vista Park is the "Winners Circle" - a small gathering area where a baseball design has been created with decorative pavers. This area will be used by teams for awards ceremonies and photos. The Winners Circle courtyard will have several benches for spectators and landscaping that will serve as a backdrop for photos. It can also serve all parents well, functioning as a designated location for picking up children after a practice or game.

Residents and leagues should be able to hit the fields in the Fall of 2004. Batter Up!

The City is the award recipient of two grants for the construction of Vista Park totaling \$400,000 to assist in the funding of this great project.

Civics Program for Weston High School Students

The City's second Weston University class was introduced at the City Commission meeting of October 20, 2003. This year the class is comprised of students from both Cypress Bay High School and the Sagemont Upper School - students interested in government and law, selected to participate in a unique educational and personal experience that will expose them to the multiple disciplines of government and various career possibilities.

The program worked so well last year, that the City Commission has committed to not only continuing the 8-month yearly course, but expanded its availability to both high schools in the City. Weston University commenced once again during Florida City Government Week, a yearly event that highlights the crucial role of city government in the lives of citizens, emphasizing how important citizen participation is to the future of our communities. With that belief, and a strong focus on the youth and future of our community, Weston University was born last year and now continues to expose yet another group of students to local government.

- Sessions are held on-site at various locations where city

- services are provided: City Hall, Police Station, Fire Station, Community Center, Calvin, Giordano & Associates, with field observation of operations and infrastructure via field trips.
- Through instruction, open conversations, observations, demonstrations and actual experiences, students will be exposed to and educated on the details involved in running municipal departments on a day-to-day basis.
- Students will be taught about State and local government by those elected to run it.
- Students will learn problem-solving procedures used by city government, recognizing the positions taken by city officials and the reasons behind them.
- Students will participate in a City Commission simulation after having gained the knowledge necessary to present and defend both sides of the agenda issues.
- Upon successful completion, students will graduate and be honored at the May 17, 2004 City Commission meeting.

Civic education is not someone else's job. The City of Weston recognizes the possible rewards of educating our students and encouraging them to become involved in their community. City leaders and staff look forward to facilitating an understanding of what local government is and the unique characteristics of Weston's city structure.

At 8PM on August 28th, 81 year old photo journalist Ernest C. Withers stood before a capacity crowd in the Weston Community Center and over the next hour and a half, captivated a spellbound audience hungry for a glimpse of the past.

Having developed literally millions of images, mainly of life in America's south, he captured America's struggles and often violent confrontations over integration; the glamour and crazed early years of rock 'n' roll; individuals who went on to become the Kings and Queens of jazz and soul; and the athletes of the Negro Baseball League, to name just a few. Mr. Withers closely covered the tension of the civil rights movement and hundreds of other events that have served to shape our country.

The traveling photo exhibit provided a compelling, captivating, historical and emotional perspective of our country's past. Mr. Withers' commentary brought a poignant personal insight, at times dramatic and oftentimes humorous. As frequently as he dropped the names of Martin Luther King, Jr., Rosa Parks, Sammy Cook, Aretha Franklin, Elvis Presley and Jackie Robinson, be brought up that of his wife of sixty plus years and added stories about his eight children. An unpretentious, dedicated family man and renowned photographer, Mr. Withers has managed to live the American Dream - happy and successful both personally and professionally. He provided us with a snapshot of that life and a lifetime of memories that we can forever view as we look back to learn from the past.

# A-OK to Park on the Swale in Residential Areas of Bonaventure

To assist in easing parking difficulties within the Bonaventure area of Weston, parking on swale areas is now permitted along public streets in residential areas. The swale is considered the area within a public right-of-way that is between the right-of-way line and the edge of the pavement. It is generally considered the area between the road and the sidewalk.

#### Restrictions include:

- Vehicles cannot block any driveways, cannot park on or across sidewalks, and cannot park over drain catch basins.
- Vehicles must park in the direction of traffic.

#### Crime Prevention Tips for the Holiday Season

With the holiday season rapidly approaching, the City of Weston and the Broward Sheriff's Office want to reinforce to residents some simple holiday safety tips that can Keep Your Holidays Safe Ones.

Be sure to go over these tips with teenagers and caregivers.

- When parking your vehicle to go shopping, <u>remember where you parked it!</u> Always park in a well lit and well traveled area. Do not park in a remote dark area.
- When you return to your vehicle, scan the interior of your car to be sure no one is hiding inside. Check to see if you are being followed.
- Have your keys in hand when approaching your vehicle. You will be ready to unlock the door and will not be delayed by fumbling and looking for your keys.
- When storing items purchased at the stores, place them out of sight. The best place is in a locked trunk.
- Do not leave your purse, wallet, or cellular telephone in plain view.
- Don't resist if someone tries to take any of your belongings. Don't chase someone who robs you, they may have a weapon. Instead, call 911!
- Lock your vehicle and put up your windows even while you are driving.
- If you go to an automatic teller machine for cash, check for people around and make sure it is well lit and in a safe location.
- Carry only the credit cards you need and avoid carrying large amounts of cash.
- If you make a purchase with your credit card, be sure to obtain the carbons or see that they are destroyed in front of you.
- Beware of the GOOD DEAL scams. Things are not always what they appear to be.
- If you are purchasing toys for small children, be sure that they are safe. You will be surprised what a small child can swallow or what can injure them.
- Drive defensively. Traffic is heavier during the holidays. Drivers may also have indulged too heavily in holiday spirits.



On January 1, 2004 All Service Refuse will be the new contracted garbage hauler for the City of Weston collecting residential and commercial garbage. The new contract, awarded by your City Commission to All Service Refuse, will provide residents with increased services and lower garbage bills!

#### AS OF JANUARY 1ST, YOU WILL BENEFIT FROM THE FOLLOWING CHANGES:

■ Lower Rates: Residential curbside collection service rates will drop by 21% Previous BFI rate: \$22.08 New All Service Rate: \$17.44 Residential containerized rates will drop by 18% Commercial rates will drop by 12%

- New Recycling Bins: Will be delivered to each residence between November 15 and December 15, 2003. One yellow and one blue bin will be delivered. OLD BINS: Residents may keep them, or may dispose of them by placing them upside down, curbside with the trash after January 1st.
