Overcoming Natures's Wallenges By Mayor Eric M. Hersh

Hurricane Wilma has certainly changed the face of Weston but she didn't blow down the spirit of our great City.

I want to thank you for your patience and understanding while we dealt with the problems associated with the storm and subsequent clean-up. Wilma was certainly the worst event ever to affect Weston, and the task of cleaning up, recovering and rebuilding is monumental. We are truly fortunate for two things — first, we had no serious injuries or deaths as a result of the storm; and second, we have been saving money and planning for the past 10 years for such an event. Our

city has significant reserves available which are being used for the clean-up effort and despite this setback, we are still in very sound financial shape.

As we review the storm event as well as our response and issues that were raised, one thing is abundantly clear - communication with our residents is of utmost importance. Our "Code Red" alert system worked exceptionally well. This system allows us to make automated calls with important information to our residents, and is capable of making over 60,000 calls per hour. The glitch is that if your telephone number is unlisted or if you use only a cell phone at

home, the system might not have your number to call. Therefore, it is very important to note that if you didn't get these "Code Red" calls, please register your phone number on our website at www.westonfl.org. Look under Residents & Visitors, and then Hurricane Information. You will see a "Code Red Sign-Up" link. Please make sure your telephone number is registered so we can effectively communicate with you in the event of any emergency or important public safety announcement.

Rebuilding what was lost in Hurricane Wilma will certainly be a daunting task for all. The individual homeowner associations throughout Weston are going to be faced with large bills for clean-up and replanting. I would recommend that each association do what we intend to do as a City, which is create and adopt a multi-year master rebuilding plan along with a

> plan on how to pay for it. Although we would like very much to see quick progress, reacting too quickly could result in mistakes being which would

> > cause work to be redone and end up costing even more. In addiwe will tion,

work with landscape professionals to attempt to replant more native material that hopefully will hold up better in adverse weather conditions.

I would also caution everyone that there are many "storm chasers" out there attempting to gain work in repairing damage. Many are fair and reputable, but there are people looking to take advantage of those with damage. Make sure contractors are licensed, insured, and reputable. Make certain that where needed, all permits are obtained through the City building department, as this will help protect you in meeting code requirements.

2005 has been a year many of us would like to forget as Mother Nature took its toll on people throughout the world. Wilma's damage will cost millions of dollars in Weston, but with your patience and help, we will recover and be better than ever. On behalf of Commissioner Stermer, Commissioner Chermak, Commissioner Cheren and Commissioner Henriksson, I thank you for your support and encouragement during what was, and still is, a very challenging period. We also want to extend our holiday wishes and a happy new year to you and your families. We look forward to a safe 2006 and beyond.


Did you Know That...

A Note From The City Manager

As we prepare to enter the city's tenth anniversary year, we do so now with a little different view.

We started in September 1996 an abundantly landscaped hometown community of less than 30,000 known for our stately royal palms and extensively planted buffers along our roadways. We continued this tradition over the years with the development of lush parks and extensive recreational facilities, marquee city entrance-ways, and yet even more landscaping, to become a diverse community of over 62,000, envied for our appearance and accomplishments. became Weston's norm. How the events of October 24, 2005 changed all that in a matter of but a few hours.

Normal is however, relative. It's what we become used to and comfortable with. In this case, Hurricane Wilma left us little choice but to get used to missing fences, toppled shrubs and trees, intersections without operating traffic signals, kids home from school for two weeks, and for some, a week or more without electricity. We can collect the curbside debris in a relatively short time, but the cutting, pruning and stump removal along the roadsides will take longer and will be a lingering reminder of our brush (no pun intended) with Mother Nature. For us, this is the new norm we must learn to cope with and move on. Others in Broward County, along the Gulf Coast and in the South Pacific, should have been so fortunate.


Aside from getting used to the new landscape, our new norm needs to include better preparedness both as a city and as individ-

uals. On the city side, we are constructing a new Public Works facility that will have full stand-by power capability. This facility will house the generators used to power our lift stations and traffic signals in the event of an FPL failure, traffic cones and barricades, and other essential items within a

storm hardened structure. Included will be a fuel facility to assure an adequate gas and diesel supply for our law enforcement, fire rescue, and essential staff for rapid and continuing response. We will also be constructing our City Hall with full stand-by power capability so that we can perform the business of the city without interruption.

Our new normality needs to extend to our individual preparedness as well. Many of us were fortunate this time to have had electricity throughout the storm event. Each of us needs to be prepared to be without electric and water for extended periods for the next hurricane season, and not count on our supermarkets, drug stores, and restaurants to be open the day after the storm. We need to count on preparedness, not luck.

So our view may be a little different, but our optimism and pride for our city are stronger than ever. What a great way to enter our tenth anniversary year and recover from our recent event with the holiday season upon us. Best wishes for the holidays and for a happy, healthy and well-prepared new year.



Deterring Bike Theft Bicycle Registration

The majority of bicycle thefts are crimes of convenience. Someone will see an unsecured bike, hop on and go to where they want to go. The bike is oftentimes then just left there. Locking a bike to a secure object or placing inside a closed garage is the best safeguard against theft.



Dive Rescue Services

To be provided by Weston Deputies

Public Safety Dive Rescue Services will be provided by specially trained and certified Broward Sheriff's Office deputies assigned to Weston. Through an agreement reached with the Sheriff's Office a minimum of three Deputy Sheriffs certified as Public Safety Divers (as established by Dive Rescue International) will be equipped and assigned to duty in the City at all times. Law enforcement officers are first to arrive on the scene of an incident, enabling divers to come to the aid of individuals trapped under water in our lakes and canals in car or boating accidents, as well as rescuing those who may have accidentally fallen into the water.

Weston has a beautiful and extensive system of water bodies. While aesthetically and environmentally beneficial for the entire community, water can also be deadly in accident situations. In such emergencies, responding Rescue Divers have the professional equipment and expertise to enter the water to perform an underwater extrication or rescue without jeopardizing their own safety.

The Dive Rescue program will include 15 members of the BSO Dive Team, each assigned to Weston and trained in Advanced Dive Rescue. Their equipment, contained within their vehicles, will consist of SCUBA gear including Aga full-face masks, fins, snorkel, tanks and buoyancy vest. With this specialized equipment divers can communicate both diver to diver, and diver to surface. A multi-channel underwater telephone system designed for professional search and rescue teams is utilized. The deputy on land simply lowers a transducer cable into the same water body as the diver, enabling communication via a hand-held microphone, while divers can coordinate with one another. This service will provide Weston residents and visitors with an added level of protection.

The personnel of District VIII-Weston are looking forward to providing this additional public safety program, further enhancing Weston's response and rescue capabilities.












Fifth Year of Bringing Weston Educators Together

This was the fifth year that Weston hosted and received unanimous participation at a luncheon inviting every school principal in Weston, from both public and private institutions, going up to grade twelve. On this occasion,

principals and administrators are invited and asked to bring along a student so that the City can also get the youthful perspective. The luncheon provides a relaxed and open environment for school principals to meet with city officials and staff, to not only communicate their needs, but to put a face with a title so that our educators become on a first name basis with staff members.

An enjoyable and informative afternoon, the luncheon serves to strengthen already established partnerships and to provide an insight into the City's resources that are available to schools in Weston.



For the ninth year in a row, Weston will maintain the same ad valorem (property tax) rate of 1.5235 for each \$1,000 of assessed value. The City Commission adopted the 2006 budget with expenditures of \$101,318,444, a

Weston Approves 2006 Final Budget

Again - Property Tax Rate Remains the Same, with Increased Services

10.45% increase over last year, primarily due to annual increases in City agreements with service providers, and revenue from a proposed borrowing for capital projects. The annual fire protection fee increased \$14.82 to \$220.76 which is assessed for each single and multi-family unit within the City.

The value of Weston properties continues to climb. This year the value of property within the City grew 11.96% for Fiscal Year 2006 over the prior year, with only 2.34% of this amount attributable to new properties; 9.62% is attrib-

utable to the growth in value of existing properties. When looking at taxable value on a per property basis, Weston is clearly ranked among the highest in the county. Property for property, Weston's properties achieve some of the highest values.

The 2006 Budget sets out the resources to complete our goals and objectives for the upcoming year. Residents can view a copy of the budget on our city website at www.westonfl.org and can also view a video presentation summarizing Weston's plans for the 2006 Budget.

- New street lighting system on Emerald Estates Drive
- Construction of a City Hall building
- · Construction of Library Park
- Replacement of the City's traffic signage system
- Reconstruction of Three Village Road & Country Isles Road
- Landscaping & curbing on South Post Road
- · Landscaping & curbing on Blatt Boulevard
- Reduction of many Indian Trace assessments

The City is continuing to work with the Arena Development Corporation toward an agreement to provide for the financing, construction, operation and management of an ice and sports arena to be located at the north end of Vista Park.

Our goal for Fiscal Year 2006 is to implement the 2015 Strategic Value and Business Plans, to implement a capital projects program that will make significant infrastructure improvements throughout the City, and to propose changes to Florida law that will best enhance the quality of life for our residents and businesses. We will continue to build upon our past goals and successes and to continue to add value to the City in everything we do.

With 12 municipal parks and the Weston Tennis Center, the Community Services Department is constantly assessing the equipment and fields at every facility. This 5-acre passive park will be located at the corner of Vista Park and Bonaventure Boulevards, adjacent to the new Broward County Weston Branch Library. After the destruction inflicted by Hurricane Katrina on the Gulf Coast states, the Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) put out a request for assistance from qualified Public Information Officers, particularly those with emergency management backgrounds. The request came through the City County Communications and Marketing Association (3CMA) of which Weston's Communication Director, Denise Barrett is a member.

The request was a perfect opportunity for Denise who, like many of us, desperately wanted to help in some way. Restrictions on volunteering included the need for the volunteers' home governmental agency to continue paying their salary, and for volunteers to be ready to be deployed to some very remote locations with primitive conditions. When she asked City Manager John Flint if the City would consider supporting these conditions, he was unconditionally support-



ive. An email on a Friday afternoon containing her resume resulted in a phone call at 6pm that same Friday asking her to be in Atlanta on Sunday morning. Packing for the worst (sleeping bag and bug repellant) Barrett arrived in Atlanta to learn she had been tapped to work with FEMA's Region IV Headquarters opening a Joint Information Center in Atlanta to support all public affairs activities focused on state and local efforts of Mississippi, Alabama, North Carolina and Georgia.

During her ten day stay, Denise was assigned to Research & Writing, developing Public Service Announcements for radio and television, and press releases to provide disaster victims with (accurate, timely, consistent and easy-to-understand) simple information about disaster response, recovery and mitigation operations. Arriving in Atlanta on September 11th there was an urgency to get information to victims on how to find lost relatives and to register with FEMA for disaster aid. She learned very quickly that in times of disaster, information can be as important as food, water and shelter and that providing a coordinated message to the public is of critical importance. Denise (wanted to make it very clear that she) in no way felt what she did compared in any way to the efforts of rescue or relief workers but rather was thankful that her professional skills allowed her to offer assistance. Asked if she would do it again, the answer was a resounding YES.

The Weston Regional Park, the heartbeat of athletic activities in the City, received a direct infusion of excitement as the newly opened YMCA brings it up to yet another level. 



Who, What, When, Where, Why & How

WHO: This change affects Weston residents, businesses and visitors.

WHAT: Two new names for separate stretches of Arvida Parkway.

ROYAL PALM BOULEVARD - from I-75 South exit, between Weston Road to Saddle Club Road GLADES PARKWAY - from Saddle Club Road north to I-75 North

WHEN: The new names will be effective beginning January 1, 2006.

WHERE: 5 1/2 mile length of Arvida Parkway.

The diagram depicts the sections of roadway that will be renamed. From Saddle Club Road north to I-75 the new street name, and the name of the exit off of I-75 North, will be **Glades Parkway**. From Saddle Club Road east past Weston Road to I-75 South, the new street name, and I-75 exit name, will be **Royal Palm Boulevard**.

WHY: Two locations, same name.

Currently Arvida Parkway intersects with I-75 at two locations within the City. Both exits/intersections have the same name: Arvida Parkway at I-75. One is

located at the north end of the City off I-75 North; the other is located at the City's main entrance off I-75 South.

The dual Arvida Parkway exits continually cause complications for Fire Rescue personnel responding to emergency calls along I–75. Callers do not or cannot always advise which stretch of I–75 they are on, other than naming the exit they are near. In all of these instances, dispatch must send a fire engine and an EMS unit, to each Arvida & I–75 intersection. Crews run at emergency speeds through traffic to both locations, creating additional risk for both rescue personnel and the public. Most importantly, while the two crews are enroute looking for which I–75 & Arvida has the accident, the additional crew is unable to respond to other calls for service elsewhere in the City.

And finally,

HOW: Department of Transportation and U.S. Post Office advised.

The Department of Transportation will be making the necessary changes to exit signs at both the I-75 North and I-75 South locations. The U.S. Post Office has been advised of the street name changes along Arvida Parkway. Businesses and residences along Arvida Parkway have been contacted and notified of the change. Other businesses within the City may wish to update any printed, audio or

website directional materials beginning January 1, 2006. The City will change internal city street signs. Mapquest and other internet-based mapping and directional assistance providers will be notified by the City.

The new names echo the desire of residents for names more reflective of our community. At the City's request, many names were sent in for consideration. The fact that the two names are used in other areas of South Florida does not pose a problem as street names are duplicative across many cities. Royal Palm Boulevard, from I-75 South to Saddle Club Road was a natural selection, as the medians and rights of way are richly lined with royal palms. The section to be named Glades Parkway, from Saddle Club Road to I-75 North (and State Road 84) reflects Weston's close proximity to the Florida Everglades which border the City on two sides.

SW 36th STREET RENAMED

Weston's SW 36th Street, which is off of South Post Road and runs west past Manatee Bay Elementary School to U.S. 27, has been renamed "Manatee Isles Drive." This new name will also take effect on January 1, 2006. A note of interest for parents of students attending Manatee Bay Elementary: The new school address will be 19200 Manatee Isles Drive.



Indian Trace received a well deserved face lift. Last paved in 1985, in October crews began resurfacing of Indian Trace from Weston Road to Bonaventure Boulevard.

Instead of smooth sailing, this \$1 million transportation project has provided residents with a smooth ride.
