As we begin our 11th year as a City, I can look back to our beginnings and be extremely proud of our accomplishments over the years. Much of our success has been as a result of forward looking planning, both strategic and financial. With the build-out of Weston virtually complete, planning will continue to play a vital role in making certain that our community needs are met, yet our financial status remains extremely healthy.

Although some minor cutbacks were necessary this year, for the most part we maintained the high level of services our community has come to expect, and still were successful in REDUCING the ad-valorem tax rate by 13.26%, which will be reflected in this year's tax bill. We continue to boast the lowest tax rate of any city in Broward County, and one of the lowest in the state, yet

our community continues to offer residents and business owners a quality community where one can be proud to live and work.

On behalf of Commissioner Stermer, Commissioner Chermak, Commissioner Henriksson and myself, our congratulations to all of the public schools in Weston for once again achieving the designation of an "A" school, based on the State of Florida's standardized testing. To my knowledge, we are the only city where every public school has the designation of an "A" school rating.

This type of success only can be achieved with outstanding principals, staff, teachers and the ongoing involvement of parents, not to mention students with a desire to learn

and succeed. Everyone should be very proud of this accomplishment.

In 2006, Eagle Point Elementary was designated as the top Elementary school in Florida, and this year, Eagle Point Elementary has been named as a National Blue Ribbon School by the United States Department of Education. This prestigious award is a remarkable achievement, with only 13 schools in Florida, and 287 schools in the United States that have received this distinction. Congratulations to the Principal, Marelise LeClerc, her entire staff, and all the students! You continue to make Weston proud.

Further on the education front, we have been working diligently with the Broward County School Board on locating a new public high school to relieve Cypress Bay. While there is still much work to be done, finally, there is some progress. Along with parent activists, we will continue to pursue the construction of the new high school, currently deemed "MMM", in the hopes we can get it up and running as soon as possible to relieve the overcrowding at Cypress Bay. Although

we will not be detracted in our goal, we should also acknowledge that despite Cypress Bay's designation as the largest high school in the United States, it continues to be one of the finest high schools in the state, and once again, achieved their "A" rating. They continue to have tremendous success in all areas, including placement of students in top universities, with many students receiving significant scholarship dollars as a result of their outstanding achievements. Congratulations to Principal Scott Neely and his staff for maintaining their focus on learning, despite the challenges of being so overcrowded.

Finally, we have successfully completed Phase I of our Master Re-Landscaping Plan which was initiated after Hurricane Wilma, and are beginning Phase II of the plan. I'm sure you can already see the improvements, with more to come. When fully completed, I'm certain our community will once again have that lush landscaping we had become accustomed to, but with plant materials which are expected to better weather the next storm.

A Note From the City Manager

Davie Commons. Full page advertisements have appeared in Weston's local newspapers and magazines, mailings have gone to Weston's homes, and some Weston residents have been invited to presentations, all done by the Davie Commons developer in an attempt to convince Weston's residents that they should want the project. Sure, it might be nice to have upscale shopping, dining and entertainment close by, but this project doesn't come without a cost, an inconvenience, and a peril.

In May of 2002, the City Commission adopted a resolution authorizing the City Manager and City Attorney to take necessary and appropriate action to protect the City from any adverse impacts of the proposed Davie Commons project. For the past five years, we have been doing just that.

What the newspaper advertisements, mailings, and presentations haven't mentioned are the adverse impacts the project has on the City of Weston.

The project consists of 1.1 million square feet of retail use, the equivalent of the Aventura Mall; 885,000 square feet of office use, the equivalent of all of the office space in Weston; and 300 hotel rooms, the equivalent of two Courtyard by Marriott hotels.

The project occurs wholly within the Town of Davie, which will receive all of the tax benefit, yet none of the local roadway improvements to access the project occurs within Davie. The Davie Town Council has prohibited the developer to have the project connect to any of Davie's local roadways. All of the local roadway improvements to access the project occur in Weston. This includes the widening of Royal Palm Boulevard to six lanes from Weston Road to Bonaventure Boulevard, and expanding the intersection of Royal Palm Boulevard and Weston Road, among others. All of the local traffic will come through the intersection of Royal Palm Boulevard and Weston Road and converge with the traffic entering and exiting I–75.

The project has only one means of public ingress and egress, which is at the Royal Palm Boulevard/I-75 interchange. There is no public connection to Shotgun Road in Davie, and the project is surrounded by water and a 30 foot high berm on the north and east sides, and water and a 30 foot high concrete wall on the south side. This limited public access severely hinders the ability to effectively evacuate the premises and will prevent adequate numbers of public safety personnel to respond in the event of a moderate to large scale emergency. Although the project proposes a small onsite fire station, the next closest fire rescue units (which will need to respond as back-up) are in Weston, which would place yet another burden upon our City.

Comparing this project to others of similar size and use, whether it be Aventura Mall, Sawgrass Mills, Town Center at Boca Raton, or any others, the one thing they all have

in common is multiple means of public access to distribute the traffic and provide for a safe public environment with adequate access for self-evacuation and public safety response.

If the project is constructed, the Town of Davie will reap a tax benefit of almost \$4 million a year in today's dollars and bear none of the costs of the traffic burden. The City of Weston will have to spend almost \$1.5 million a year in today's dollars, and increasing every year thereafter, for additional Broward Sheriff's Office deputies to deal with the entire traffic burden.

If the project is constructed, the Town of Davie's public safety resources are distant and have limited access to the

site, and the next closest units, whether police, fire or EMS, are coming from Weston, at Weston's expense and no longer available to Weston's residents and businesses.

If the project is constructed, it will be at a cost, an inconvenience, and a peril to the residents and businesses of Weston. This was not included in the developer's newspaper and magazine advertisements, mailings, or presentations.

Davie Commons. It has a long way to go to obtain the necessary approvals at various levels of government. We will continue to present our case at each and every turn to protect Weston's residents and businesses from these and all adverse impacts of the proposed project.

The vacancy was created by Commissioner Sharon Cheren's resignation from the City Commission upon the decision to move out of the state.

Mr. Gomez will be sworn in at the February 4, 2008 Commission meeting and will serve the remainder of the unexpired term until the next regular election on November 4, 2008. Return to the polls on **Tuesday, January 29th** to vote in the Presidential Preference Primary

ALL CLEAN PAPER GOES INTO ONE BIN


Mixed paper can now be combined in the same bin with your newspaper recycling.

The City of Weston received the **Distinguished Budget Presentation Award from the** Government Finance Officers Association of the U.S. and Canada (GFOA).

This is the fifth year that the City has submitted the annual budget for consideration and the fifth year of award recognition. David E. Keller, Assistant City Manager/CFO and Darrel Thomas, Treasurer prepared the annual budget pursuant to the GFOA guidelines and requirements and made the submittal on behalf of the City of Weston.

2008 Weston Budget A 13.26% Tax Reduction

In September of 2007 the City Commission adopted a budget for Fiscal Year 2008 that met the mandates of the state legislature implemented property tax reform. Cities were required to set their millage rate at the 2007 "rolled-back" rate and then Weston was required to decrease that rate by an additional 7%. The City of Weston had not raised its millage rate since incorporation, which was 1.5235. The newly adopted rate for Fiscal Year 2008 is 1.3215.

The total amount of revenue budgeted by the City is \$5.7 million lower than last year, excluding last year's budgeted reimbursements of \$4.0 million for hurricane cleanup (otherwise the revenue budgeted for this year is \$9.7 million lower than last year). Even considering the increase in taxable assessed value of property in the City, budgeted ad valorem taxes decreased by \$795 thousand as compared with last year's budget, or \$1.7 million lower than they would have been if the City Commission had not lowered the millage (tax) rate. Total expenditures decrease by \$2.2 million, primarily because the City is budgeting less for capital projects in the new year.

The City Commission adopted a \$103,709,113 budget that met the mandated reduction by:

 Deferring a proposed wi-fi project to connect the City's public buildings during a disaster event







- Eliminating holiday lights at city entrances
- Eliminating the city annual performance report publication and reducing costs on the newsletter
- Eliminating the July 4th evening events and fireworks display, and
- Restructuring contracts with existing service providers

The Budget Includes:

- No decrease in public safety service
- No decrease in maintenance of infrastructure
- Preservation of prudent fund balances/reserves
- Reconstruction of the Saddle Club Road/Indian Trace traffic signal
- Construction of the Saddle Club Road/Bonaventure Blvd. traffic signal
- Implementation of the first phase of the traffic signage replacement program, and
- Implementation of Priority Two of the 2006 Master Re-landscaping Plan

Public Works Center - Ten years after running operations out of two trailers, city crews have moved into a permanent 12,000 square foot facility located at 2599 Saddle Club Road. This building provides office and document storage space and enclosed storage for tools, equipment and vehicles. The facility is equipped with an integrated backup generator. Following Hurricane Wilma, the inability to acquire fuel was a major obstacle that impeded emergency responses throughout the county; our new facility includes a fuel facility for city and emergency vehicles. Public Works services include the landscape, irrigation, pavement and drainage maintenance of the public rights-of-way, and the maintenance of the public water bodies. Utilities services include the maintenance of the water mains, sanitary sewer mains, and lift stations. The new Public Works contact number is 954-385-2600.

City Hall - After leasing office space since 1997, Weston City Hall has a permanent home at 17200 Royal Palm Boulevard on 3.5 acres of City owned land that adjoins the Police and Fire Departments.

A one-story, 14,000 square-foot structure, the building includes a state-of-the-art Commission chamber with theater-style seating for 154 persons, so for the first time in Weston's history, City Commission meetings will take place at City Hall. An extremely important feature of the building is an integrated backup generator so that city operations can continue in the event of power failures.

City Hall houses the departments of the City Manager, City Clerk, Finance and Communications. There are conference

rooms for the City Commission and staff, along with much needed expanded office and storage areas. The lobby provides residents and visitors with city information in a comfortable setting and includes two computer stations to access city codes. Filing for a Homestead Exemption

All Florida residents are eligible for a Homestead Exemption on their permanent residence, which provides a tax saving on the first \$25,000 of the assessed value of the property.

Representatives from the Broward County Property Appraiser's Office will be at the Weston Community Center (located inside Weston Regional Park), to assist you with filing your Homestead Exemption application.

Monday, December 3, 4:00 – 7:00 p.m. Monday, Januray 7, 4:00 – 7:00 p.m. Monday, February 4, 4:00 – 7:00 p.m.

What You Need When Filing Your Homestead Exemption:

All owners occupying the property must file in person on jointly held property. If you are married and the Deed has a different last name for a husband and wife, a marriage certificate must be presented.

Proof of Ownership:

Recorded Warranty Deed, Co-op Propriety Lease, Notice of Proposed Taxes or Tax Receipt. If the property is held in a trust, please provide a notarized Certificate of Trust or a complete copy of the trust agreement.

Proof of Permanent Florida Residence:

Preferably dated prior to January 1 of the tax year for which you are filing: Florida's Driver's License or Florida I.D. Card, plus one of the following: Florida Voter's Registration or Recorded Declaration of Domicile

Non-U.S. Citizens:

All of the items listed above AND proof of permanent residency such as asylum/parolee statue or other PRU-COL status

*If you have a Homestead Exemption in another state or county on another property you currently own, you will not be eligible for a Homestead Exemption until you surrender the exemption in the other jurisdiction.

PHASE II REPLANTING TO BEGIN

Master Re-Landscaping Plan

With Priority I of the Re-Landscaping Plan completed, Priority II plantings, budgeted for the second fiscal year of the City's 2006 Master Re-Landscaping Plan will be implemented over the next ten months.


PRIORITY II

Will target 30,650 lf (5.8 miles) in five main areas:

- Glades Parkway between Saddle Club Road and Savannah, west side;
- Glades Parkway from Glades Circle to Gator Run, west side;

- Saddle Club Road between Royal Palm Boulevard and South Post Road, north and south sides;
- Those portions of Country Isles and Three Village with moderate or greater damage, within the area bordered by Indian Trace, Weston Road, Royal Palm Blvd., and Bonaventure Blvd.; and
- SR84 from Indian Trace west to Canal.

Priority II plantings were budgeted for the Fiscal Year 2008 budget (Oct. 1, 2007 thru Sept. 30, 2008). The cost estimated for this phase, inclusive of construction, design,



demolition, and contingency totals \$1.8 million.

Once Phase II is completed, the City will move to Priority III, during Fiscal Year 2009. The locations within Priority III are extensive. Full aerial maps outlining the areas in Phase III and all areas in the Re-landscaping plan are available on the City's web site at www.westonfl.org. Under Public Works & Utilities or Parks and Recreation: click on Post Hurricane Wilma 2006 Master Re-Landscaping Plan.

PRIORITY III

The third priority would complete the remainder of the City:

- Approximately 63,000 lf (13 miles) of areas designated as moderate to total damage;
- Approximately 196,500 lf (37 miles) of areas designated as minor damage.

The third priority is scheduled for implementation in the Fiscal Year 2009 budget (beginning Oct. 1, 2008). The cost estimated for the Priority III Project, inclusive of construction, design, demolition, and contingency totals \$3.9 million. This would be the final phase and completed in year three of the re-landscaping plan.

Weston has utilized native species and drought tolerant materials that will better withstand South Florida's elements. The design will buffer residential areas from the view and sounds of traffic, and serve as a visually aesthetic landscape.

New plantings will never replace the mature trees that were destroyed during Hurricane Wilma but they will quickly thrive and fill out in our tropical climate. We thank you for your patience as crews continue to replant Weston.

Program Goals are Realized

At the start of each year's program, students are provided a binder of materials, including the following goals:

- Create a unique educational and personal experience for high school students through open communication with government officials and city departments.
- Expose students to the multiple layers of government and various career possibilities.
- Provide a civic education on government in Florida.
- Enable students to understand procedures for making their opinions and concerns known to local government.

Through student feed back the City has always known that the program was making an impact but in 2007 the results came full circle. Two students from the inaugural class (2002/2003), now college students, interned with Calvin, Giordano & Associates, Inc. (CGA), the city's contract agent for planning, engineering and landscape architecture.

Lauren Sher, currently a senior at the University of Florida, decided to pursue a degree in civil engineering after being in the Weston University program and spending a day at the offices of CGA. Lauren said that the idea of being in on the ground floor of planning a city or its components seemed so exciting and something that she had never considered. Both Lauren and Marissa thoroughly enjoyed their internships, gaining practical work experience and were particularly thrilled to work on projects within the City of Weston. Charles Kreafle, a student in our second year of the program interned over the summer for U.S. Senator Bill Nelson, also spending a day shadowing Weston Mayor Eric Hersh.

Having exposed students to different career opportunities within both the public and private sectors that encompass state and local government and seeing them first hand come full circle has given the City great pride. Several students have changed their college career paths due to the program and we know that whatever city they land in, the community will ultimately benefit from their knowledge and resolve to make a difference.

Best Wishes for a Wonderful and Safe Holiday Season

- When parking your vehicle to go shopping, remember where you parked it! Always park in a well lit and well traveled area. Do not park in a remote dark area.
- When you return to your vehicle, scan the interior of your car to be sure no one is hiding inside. Check to see if you are being followed.
- Have your keys in hand when approaching your vehicle.
- When storing items purchased at the stores, place them out of sight. The best place is in a locked trunk.
- Do not leave your purse, wallet, or cellular telephone in plain view.
- Don't resist if someone tries to take any of your belongings. Don't chase someone who robs you, they may have a weapon. Instead, call 911!
- Lock your vehicle and put up your windows even while you are driving.
- If you go to an automatic teller machine for cash, check for people around and make sure it is well lit and in a safe location.
- Carry only the credit cards you need and avoid carrying large amounts of cash.

Drive defensively. Traffic is heavier during the holidays. Drivers may also have indulged too heavily in holiday spirits.

FIRE SAFETY: Each year fires occurring during the holiday season injure 2,600 people and cause over \$930 million in damage. Simple precautions can greatly reduce your chances of becoming a holiday fire casualty:

- If purchasing a holiday tree, needles should be green and hard to pull back from the branches; trunk should be sticky to the touch.
- Keep trees away from any heat source which will dry it out faster; Keep stand filled with water.
- Inspect holiday lights before putting up for frayed wires, bare spots, broken sockets or excessive kinking.
- Do not link up more than 3 light strands. Check wires periodically – they should not be warm to the touch.
- Use only nonflammable metallic trees and decorations.
- Never put wrapping paper in a fireplace it can throw off dangerous sparks and produce a chemical buildup in the home that can cause an explosion.
- Never leave lights or lit candles unattended.


