Did You Know...

That students cast votes in August elections through Kids Voting Broward. Students continue to learn about the importance of voting through opportunities presented by Kids Voting Broward. In alignment with early and Election Day primary voting, more than 5,500 students took part in the voting for county candidates through the District's electronic voting program. In partnership with Broward Public Schools, students have been voting online since the 2004 elections. The main objective of the August election was to prepare students to cast their ballots for a very important national election coming up in November. Kids Voting Broward representatives believe they will break the single-election record of 61,000 electronic votes submitted by students, set in January of 2008.

A Note From the City Manager

John R. Flint, City Manager

This fall has been a very busy and a very exciting time for us. First and foremost, three members of our City Commission were re-elected without opposition. Our congratulations to Mayor Hersh, Commissioner Henriksson, and Commissioner Gomez; we look forward to continue working with them along with Commissioner Stermer and Commissioner Chermak in what will be Weston's seventh City Commission.

We have completed the task of the staff preparing and the City Commission adopting the Fiscal Year 2009 budgets for the City, the Bonaventure Development District, and the Indian Trace Development District. We are fortunate that we did not have to use any General Fund reserves to balance the City's budget, leaving all of these funds available for us to prepare for, respond to and recover from any storm event that may occur. We are also fortunate that we are able to maintain all of our police, emergency medical and fire protection services, along with our parks



and recreation programs and the maintenance of our landscaping. The budgets, including my budget message to the City Commission, are available on our website, www. westonfl.org.

You will notice a new look for our EMS (Emergency Medical Service) vehicles and our fire trucks. The City recently purchased and took delivery of five new EMS trucks, four new fire engines, and one new tower ladder truck. These state-of-the-art vehicles are to be owned by the City and operated by the Broward Sheriff's Office Department of Fire Rescue and Emergency Services. The City's decision to own the vehicles, rather than have the Sheriff provide the vehicles, resulted in a savings of \$1.2 million per year. One thing that hasn't changed is the dedication and outstanding service provided by the men and women of the Broward Sheriff's Office who will staff these vehicles.

By now our single-family homeowners have received their new carts for garbage collection. The automated cart collection system is becoming the preferred system nation-wide as it requires less labor and provides for a clean, uniform appearance on collection day. Weston now enjoys the lowest rate of any city in Broward County using this automated collection system. We greatly appreciate everyone's patience during this transition period.

Library Park will officially open on October 30th. Rarely does the opportunity come along to take advantage of a synergy with a neighbor that builds on that synergy, creates a unique setting, and provides a great experience from design all the way through to use. The Weston Branch Library was the impetus for Library Park that provides facilities for readers, story-telling, and students of all ages. The

Florida Author's Fountain showcases those Floridians who contributed to our literary culture. The Weston History Walk tells of our city's rich history from the earliest days to the present. The gazebos are perfect for story-time, school class visits, and outdoor classrooms. The open lawn is a great space for book fairs and other cultural events, or to spread a blanket and read in the sun. The benches around the fountain invite relaxation to watch and listen to the rushing waters. To make the park even more attractive, Wi-Fi will be available in the Spring of 2009.

Lastly, the current economic climate has given us all varying causes for concern. Properties in various states of foreclosure are at an all time high in Weston, which may result in some properties not being maintained and thereby detracting from the appearance of the surrounding properties. In the event that a property in your area is not being maintained, you may call your community maintenance association or the city's Code Enforcement office for assistance. Please keep in mind that any enforcement action, by the community maintenance association or Code Enforcement, entitles the property owner, whether it is the occupant or a lending institution, to due process and therefore results may take some time to achieve.

Parks Undale

With 13 municipal parks and the Weston Tennis Center, Weston residents have the chance to enjoy an array of amenities for every age and lifestyle. The Community Services Department is constantly assessing the equipment and fields at every facility. Maintenance, improvements and upgrades are provided to preserve and enhance the superb quality of our Weston parks system.

Improvements include:

Weston Regional Park - A new generation of skate park equipment has been installed at the City's skate park. The new ramps, half pipes, and grinding rails are engineered to withstand the heavy use of our skaters while standing up to Florida's heat and sun exposure. To ensure safety participants must wear a helmet, elbow pads and knee pads. Participants under the age of 17 must have a parent sign a waiver form available at the Community Center or online at www.westonfl.org.

Emerald Estates Park & Tequesta Trace Park - The new

playground surfaces at these two parks are now complete. Temporary playground closures at Gator Run Park, Vista Park and Eagle Point Park are expected in the coming months as those facilities will be upgraded with the new, poured-in-place rubberized playground surfacing. This product, used in parks around the country, including Walt Disney World, provides for a safe, consistent surface that will limit injuries due to falls while providing for greater accessibility and meet ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) requirements.

Tequesta Trace Park - Construction will soon begin on upgrades to the entrance of the park. In addition, the stadium football field will be renovated to provide for better drainage. A small storage facility is being built to house athletic equipment which will eliminate the need for temporary storage containers.

Library Park - Construction is complete! In addition to the signature fountain, with plaques recognizing famous Florida authors, which provides for a quiet location to sit and read,

the park features three pavilions of various sizes, walking paths adorned with plaques detailing Weston's archeological history and a restroom facility. For details regarding the Grand Opening of Library Park, Thur., Oct. 30 at 7:00 pm, please see the article in this Announcer.

Reminders: Children should have adult supervision while on the City's playgrounds. Please help prevent injury:

- Don't wear clothes with drawstrings or other loose items that could get caught on play equipment.
- Don't wear bicycle helmets while on the play equipment.
- Shoes should be worn while playing.

Even with shade covers and play surfacing designed to resist heat retention adults should check the temperatures on the play equipment, particularly on hot days. And, we strongly encourage the use of sunscreen while outdoors.

The Wait Is Over...

Automated Curbside Garbage Collection System in the City of Weston has begun!

Helpful Reminders Regarding This New System

What goes in the cart and when is it collected?

Household garbage should be bagged before being placed in the cart. Lids are designed to seal in odors and overlap



for rain protection. They will not blow open in windy conditions. Lids will close automatically after cart is emptied. Your garbage and recycling collection schedule remains the

same. Recycling still goes in your recycling bins. Collection begins at 7 a.m. All carts and bins must be curbside prior to 7 a.m.

Where do I place the cart on collection day?

When the cart was delivered, it was placed at the best location for pick-up. Place the cart near or at the curb and at least three feet away from your mailbox, trees, fire hydrants, gas or water meters or anything collection equipment could damage. **Always place the cart at the curb with the wheels and handle toward your residence.

Curbside parking on collection day

Do not park at the curb on collection day. If a car is blocking the safe collection of your cart by the automated equipment, the driver will not pick-up at that time and you will not receive collection service. In those few instances where parking is an extreme problem, or where sidewalks are narrow, place carts on the driveway or next to the curb with the wheels against the curb, and park autos so as to accommodate the new system, a minimum of three feet away from cart.

Can I dispose of my old garbage can?

Yes. If you don't want to keep it for other purposes, old, empty garbage cans may be set out at the curb for disposal for one month after your automated collection began. Mark the can clearly with a large "X" and place it out with your trash for weekly collection. You can use paint or tape to mark the "X", but the can MUST be empty to ensure collection.

What if I move?

The cart belongs to the City of Weston and must remain at your residence.

What if my cart is stolen, damaged or destroyed?

Do not mark or alter the cart in any way. If the cart is damaged or stolen, the following policy applies: If the damage is your fault, you will be required to pay for a replacement (\$62.00). If the collection contractor damages your cart it will be replaced at no charge. The serial number on the cart helps the city locate lost or stolen carts and return them to their proper home.

What if I want an additional cart?

You can purchase either a 96-gallon or 64-gallon cart for a one-time charge of \$62.00 for either size.






FEMA approves Weston Debris Management Plan

The City is pleased to announce that FEMA, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, has approved the City of Weston's Debris Management Plan. This is only the third plan to be approved in Broward County. Having the plan approved means that the City of Weston is now eligible for an additional five percent (5%) Federal cost share for eligible Category-A-Debris removal work. After a hurricane this can amount to a substantial amount of money additionally reimbursed to the City.

One simple thing that I told her has seemed to help her find a lot more confidence in her ground-strokes, and hopefully this tip can help you as well. 


BSO & Weston Formed New Summer Program Educates Weston Youth in Police Services Academy

From June through July, twenty-seven Weston students, ages 12-16, were a part of a brand new program initiated by the Broward Sheriff's Office in Weston: The Weston University - Broward Sheriff's Office Police Services Academy. 



Residential Curbside Collection units: All bulk trash must be out on your curbside by 7:00 am.

What are Bulk Items?

Bulk collection items are those items that are not disposed of in your regular commercial container.

Bulk items include, but are not limited to:

- •Furniture
- •Mattresses and carpets and other large household items
- •Large and small appliances such as dishwashers, laundry machines, and stoves.
- •Refrigerators or air conditioners must have Freon removed by a certified dealer.

NOTE: Mirrors, glass, glass tabletops, windowpanes, and plate glass items should be safely placed in a rigid container to facilitate safe collection. Larger glass items such as table tops, shower doors, windows should be placed separately from the rest of the bulk pickup.

Bulk items **DO NOT** include contractor-generated material, or vegetative waste (landscape materials) or household hazardous waste (HHW). Vegetative/Landscape waste is collected with your regular garbage collection.

Where to place Bulk Items for collection?

Bulk items should be placed at or near the same location where your regular garbage is collected. Do not place bulk items near overhead obstructions, trees, mailboxes, or automobiles. Do not place bulk items in any manner that would limit the regular garbage service you receive. Weston Historical Artifacts on Display in Weston Branch Library

Many years of perseverance by the City and the Weston Historical Society has finally paid off in the way of a great benefit to Weston residents. Since Weston's incorporation in 1996, the city and county have had talks of a branch library within the city, and in that library would be a display of Weston's archeological history. Talks date back to when then-Library Director Sam Morrison, City Manager John Flint and Roy Rogers of Arvida, sat in Weston's leased office space envisioning what would become an Educational Complex at the corner of Bonaventure Boulevard and Vista Park Boulevard, containing schools, a library and a park. Today that area is host to Cypress Bay High School, Falcon Cove Middle School, the Weston Branch Library/BCC Weston Campus and Library Park which opens this October. Dreams really do come true. The Weston Historical Society's dream of having an archeological display case in the library to educate and inspire residents is also now a reality.

WHAT YOU WILL FIND IN THE DISPLAY

We encourage residents to visit the display, located just inside the library lobby at 4205 Bonaventure Boulevard. To give you a sampling of what you will find, the display includes:

Fossilized bones from a Weston fossil site, discovered by local residents while searching for natural crystals in the dredge piles of an excavated lake in the city: Vertebra fragment, leg bone fragment (possible horse), leg and foot bones and horse

teeth. During the Pleistocene period, over 12,000 years ago, herds of large animals, now extinct, lived in South Florida. Saber tooth cats, horses, dire wolves, mammoth, caribou and bison were common.

Prehistoric Indians inhabited South Florida for over 11,000 years at sites throughout Broward County. Additional artifacts displayed are of cultural remains of the Tequesta Indians. These are from the Glades period sites dating from 800 A.D. to 1700 A.D., and include: shell adze tool, shell celt or scraper tool; prehistoric pottery: Key Largo Incised rim shard, Glades Tooled rim sherd, St. Johns stamped sherds, turtle bone fragments, drilled shark teeth, alligator tooth, drilled shark vertebrae, and shell, pottery and faunal bone from the midden site.

The City was pleased to fund the design and construction of the display case being housed in the Weston Branch Library under an Agreement with the Broward County Commission. We would be remiss if we did not mention the tenacity and patience of Weston Historical Society member Mona Habib in helping to bring this display to fruition.

The new Public Works Services Center, is home to 20 staff members and the administrative management of essential public works services including; landscape, irrigation, pavement and drainage maintenance of the public rights-of-way and maintenance of the public water bodies within the City. Utility services include the maintenance of water mains, sanitary sewer mains and lift stations.

City to Enter National Flood Insurance Program's Community Rating System

What you should know about flooding and flood insurance

This article is required by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to satisfy provisions of the Community Rating System (CRS) for reduced costs for flood insurance.

FEMA

In 1968 the Congress of the United States established the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to, among other things, assist communities implement floodplain management measures to reduce the risk of flood to new developments. FEMA is responsible for preparing Flood Insurance Rate Maps that show the flood zone areas for each community, including the City of Weston. The 100 year flood is the national standard upon which flood insurance requirements are based. The entire City of Weston is in a flood zone and therefore the City urges all property owners and renters to purchase flood insurance to protect against the devastating loss that rising waters can cause.

Flood Insurance

To further help prevent and minimize the damages caused by floodwaters, the City of Weston is in the process of entering into the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). The program allows property owners and renters to purchased federally backed flood insurance. The City's application for participation in the CRS will, upon final acceptance by FEMA, enable property owners and renters to qualify for discounted flood insurance premiums. In the Spring of 2009, when the City anticipates receiving its rating from FEMA, the City will then notify residents how to qualify for discounted premiums.

Flood Warnings

The City of Weston, in coordination with Broward County, has a warning system in place to alert residents to the potential flooding and its dangers. Residents will be notified via the

City's CodeRED emergency telephone call system, the local government cable television channels, and posting on the City's website, www.westonfl.org. Residents and businesses may register their land line and/or their cell phone numbers via the City's website or by calling the City's Communications Department at 954–385–2000.

Flood Safety

Flooding is always a potential threat to due to South Florida's sub-tropical climate. It is important to always be prepared and to take precautionary measures to minimize potential property damage caused by flooding by taking the few, simple steps:

- Turn off all electricity and natural gas
- Always have a battery powered device (radio or television) to monitor flood warning information
- Comply with officials when evacuation directions are given, usually by television, radio, or CodeRED
- Know your evacuation zone and route, and an alternate, as roadways may be impassable or indistinguishable from lakes due to flooding
- Be especially careful when moving about in the dark in flooded areas.



Storm Water Management

Storm water enters the City's management system through catch basins. The City has a comprehensive preventive maintenance program whereby each basin on the City's public rights-of-way is inspected once per year and obstructive debris from within is removed. Property owners are urged to keep catch basin grates on or adjacent to their property clear of tree limbs, palm fronds, leaves and any debris that may obstruct the flow of water into the basin.



It is a violation of City and state laws to dump trash or introduce pollutants into the City's water bodies and wetland mitigation areas.






THE THREE LITTLE PIGS


