Scope. As it pertainsetoethis section, eiteis theeresponsibilityeofethe roofing contractoretoeprovideethe owner withetheerequired roofing permit, eandetoexplain toethe ownere the econtente of this section. eThe provisions of Sectione R4402e governe the eminimum erequirements eand estandard seof ethe eindustrye foreroofing esystem installations. eAdditionally, etheefollowing itemses hould be eaddressed eas parte of ethe eagreement between ethe owner eandethee contractor. eThe eowner's einitial eine the edesignated espace eindicates ethat ethe eitem ehase been explained.

7.eVentilation: Most roof structures should have some ability to vent natural airflow throughout the interior of the structural assembly (the building itself). The existing amount of attice
6.eOverflow scuppers (wall outlets): It is required that rainwater flow off so that the roof iso not overloaded from a buildup of water. Perimeter/edge walls or other roof extensions may block this discharge if overflow scuppers (wall outlets) are not provided. It may be necessaryed to install overflow scuppers in accordance with the requirements of Sections R4402, R44036 and R4413.e
5.ePonding water: The current roof system and/or deck of the building may not drain well and may cause water to pond (accumulate) in low-lying areas of the roof. Ponding can be and indication of structural distress and may require the review of a professional structurale engineer. Ponding may shorten the life expectancy and performance of the new roofing system. Ponding conditions may not be evident until the original roofing system is removed. Ponding conditions should be corrected.e
 4. Exposed ceilings: Exposed, open beam ceilings are where the underside of the roof deckinged can be viewed from below. The owner may wish to maintain the architectural appearance; therefore, roofing nail penetrations of the underside of the decking may not be acceptable. These owner provides the option of maintaining this appearance.e
3. Common roofs: Common roofs are those which have no visible delineation between neighboring units (i.e., townhouses, condominiums, etc.). In buildings with common roofs, the roofing contractor and/or owner should notify the occupants of adjacent units of roofing worker to be performed.
2.eRe-nailing wood decks: When replacing rooting, the existing wood roof deck may have to be re-nailed in accordance with the current provisions of Section R4403. (The roof deck ise usually concealed prior to removing the existing roof system).e
Le Aesthetics-workmanship: The workmanship provisions of Section R4402 are for thee purpose of providing that the roofing system meets the wind resistance and water intrusione performance standards. Aesthetics (appearance) are not a consideration with respect toe workmanship provisions. Aesthetic issues such as color or architectural appearance, that aree not part of a zoning code, should be addressed as part of the agreement between the owner ande the contractor.e
