











**Sparklers** are the most common cause of firework-related injuries.

Though legal, sparklers can reach temperatures of 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit at the tip - hot enough to cause third degree burns or permanent disfigurement.

As for what kinds of fireworks are illegal in Florida - if it flies (becomes airborne) or explodes (goes boom), it's illegal.

If you want to see **fireworks**, it's best left to the professionals.

Fireworks cause an average of 20,000 reported fires annually in the U.S., according to the National Fire Protection Association.



On a typical Independence Day, more fires are reported than on any other day.

Firing a gun in the air is not only against the law, it's extremely dangerous. Remember, falling bullets kill.

It can happen to anyone. In fact, Jason Pierre-Paul (Tampa Bay Buccaneers) was permanently injured due to a fireworks accident.
