OUTDOOR FIREWORKS DISPLAY APPLICATION

The responsible party submitting the application to provide an outdoor fireworks display must submit all requested information outlined in this document 30 days prior to the event date. The responsible party must comply with the code requirements as outlined in the Florida Fire Prevention Code and NFPA 1123 - Code for Fireworks Display.

All information requested below must be submitted for review with this completed application form. Permit approval shall not be obtained if document package is incomplete. Please check each box signifying the attached information is contained in the proceeding paperwork:

- 1. Copy of Licenses (State, Federal, etc.)
- 2. Proof of liability insurance (Broward Sheriff's Office, Broward County Commission and the City of Weston Named as Additional Insured).
- 3. Site plan to include (see sample attached):
 - Display site-identify significant ground features, public rights of way, significant buildings or structures, overhead obstructions, parking areas, and spectator viewing areas (show dimensions)
 - Location of fireworks storage areas
 - · Identify dimensions of discharge site
 - Fall out area, <u>including dimensions</u>
 - North arrow
 - Location of significant roadways, including access and control points
 - Traffic plans indicating the flow of vehicles into and out of the site before and after display
 - Identify method of sectioning off display area from public (cones, barricades, security, (etc.)
 - Location of emergency vehicle staging area and access routes
- 4. Discharge details (arrangement and size of mortars, firing mechanisms, distances of personnel from electronic firing mortars)
- 5. Supply specifications and instructions for the proper setup and use of each electrical firing units and accompanying junctions.
- Letter from company confirming HDPE racks meet the 2000 NFPA 1123 requirements.
- 7. Product listing and site operator experience resume.
- 8. Communication devices & contact numbers (Tech to fire inspectors at display)
- 9. Site security previsions during the course of the setup.
- 10. Operating procedures:
 - Identification of operator and all technicians scheduled for display
 - Copies of applicable display personnel licenses, permits, certificate of fitness
 - Describe firing method
- 11. Termination procedures:
 - Procedures for inspecting the discharge site and fall out area for any defective or unexploded fireworks.
 - Procedure for disposing of defective fireworks and fire works material.
- 12. Emergency procedures:
 - Description of the means of alerting staff of emergencies.
 - Identification of means of notifying fire department.
 - Identification of alerting the fire department, operator, to terminate the loading or firing of fireworks in the event of a hazard arises during the outdoor display.

Fire protection required:

Minimum two (2) approved 2.5 gallon pressurized water fire extinguishers with updated service tags, provided by pyrotechnician on site. Other fire protection may be required if conditions warrant.

Stand by Fire Watch:

Broward Sheriff's Office

Fire Marshal's Bureau

One or more standby firewatch personnel and/or equipment shall be required depending on conditions. Firewatch personnel shall be Certified Fire Inspector or Certified Firefighter employed by Broward Sheriff's Office, Department of Fire Rescue and under the direction of the Fire Chief.

Standby firewatch personnel will be on duty from the time fireworks are delivered at the site until termination of the display activities and the removal of all fireworks and debris from the site.

*(All fees for Permits, Inspections, and Firewatch Services shall be paid in full <u>prior</u> to event permit approval receipt. In the event, that you will require additional fire watch hours due to extended hours, once the approval has been issued, please contact the Fire Marshals' Office during regular business hours. After hours, contact our Dispatch Center (954-765-5100) to contact the On Duty FM.

Firewatch personnel to be determined per the Broward Sheriff's Office, Department of Fire Rescue policy.

Wind Velocity Limitations:	
No fireworks display shall be held when velocity is 20 miles per hour or more.	
Special Conditions:	
Seizure of Fireworks:	
The Fire Chief or designee shall seizer, take, remove, or cause to be removed, at the expense of the owner, all stocks of fireworks offered or exposed for sale, stored or held in violation of the code.	
BY ORDER OF THE FIRE MARSHAL: Any violations of requirements for this firework display permit shall be cause for immediate revocation of said permit, at the discretion of the Fire Chief or Designee.	
Broward Sheriff's Office or any agents therefore shall not be responsible for any losses suffered due to revocation of said permit.
