NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

The City Commission of the City of Weston proposes to adopt the following Ordinances:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WESTON, FLORIDA, PROVIDING FOR AMENDMENT OF THE CITY CHARTER BY AMENDING SECTION 7.05, "CHARTER REVISION;" TO PROVIDE THAT THE CHARTER REVIEW BOARD SHALL, AT ITS FIRST MEETING, SELECT FROM ITS MEMBERS A CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR; PROVIDING REQUISITE BALLOT LANGUAGE FOR SUBMISSION TO ELECTORS; PROVIDING FOR ADOPTION OF ENABLING RESOLUTION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

AND

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WESTON, FLORIDA, PROVIDING FOR AMENDMENT OF THE CITY CHARTER BY AMENDING SECTION 2.02, "MAYOR;" TO PROVIDE THAT THE CITY COMMISSION SHALL, EACH YEAR, APPOINT ONE OF ITS MEMBERS TO SERVE AS VICE MAYOR; PROVIDING REQUISITE BALLOT LANGUAGE FOR SUBMISSION TO ELECTORS; PROVIDING FOR ADOPTION OF ENABLING RESOLUTION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

A Public Hearing on the Ordinances will be held by the City Commission Monday, April 1, 2024, and a Second and Final Hearing will be held Monday, April 15, 2024, at 7:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as possible, at Weston City Hall, 17200 Royal Palm Boulevard, Weston, Florida. The City Commission may continue or defer the hearing to a new date and time certain without further notice provided the date and time of the continuance or deferral is announced at the hearing. The Ordinances in their entirety may be inspected at the Office of the City Clerk during regular working hours.

Pursuant to Florida Statutes 286.0105, if a person decides to appeal any decision made by the City Commission with respect to any matter considered at such meeting or hearing, he or she will need a record of the proceedings, and for such purpose, he or she may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which record includes testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.

Any and all interested parties may appear at the above meeting and be heard with respect to the proposed items.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WESTON, FLORIDA, REZONING THE 6.659-ACRE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 357 RACQUET CLUB ROAD, CONSISTING OF APPROXIMATELY 5.007 ACRES FROM LOW RISE MULTI FAMILY (MF2) ZONING DISTRICT AND APPROXIMATELY 1.652 ACRES FROM COMMERCIAL (C-1) ZONING DISTRICT TO MID RISE MULTI FAMILY (MF3) ZONING DISTRICT; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
